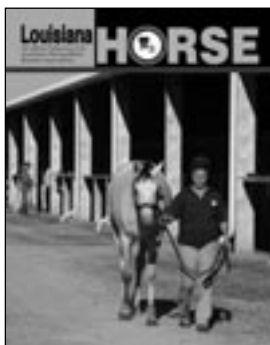

BREEDING SHED

Keeping the Membership informed, LTBA President Warren J. Harang, III

The 2022 thoroughbred yearling sales have concluded with numbers up across the board. The LTBA's Breeders Sales of Louisiana, which held its Yearling Sale followed by Mixed Session October 1st, is no exception. The 2022 sale grossed \$1,690,600, nearly double the 2021 gross of \$898,000. Yearling average and median were \$16,739 and \$10,000 up from 2021 numbers of \$13,027 and \$8,000 respectively. One of my goals for the LTBA has been to raise the value of our product and I am very pleased to see these numbers increasing.

Delta Downs 2022-23 Season is underway with an 84 day race meet with Premier Night on February 4, 2023. Premier Night is the first of the Louisiana Bred stakes days of the year and features ten stakes exclusively for accredited Louisiana Breds.

New Orleans Fair Grounds is forgoing its traditional

Thanksgiving opening to start its 151st season on November 18. The anticipated increase in monies from Historical Racing and Sports Wagering are beginning to be evident, with a total of twelve new stakes races for Louisiana Breds worth \$850,000 in purses, including six new Louisiana Bred stakes on opening weekend. This brings the number of stakes for Louisiana Breds up to 29 with a total of \$2.475 million in purses. Add to that \$50,000 Maiden Special Weight purses and Allowance purses ranging from \$46,000 to \$52,000 making it evident that it does indeed pay to breed and race Louisiana Breds.

Champions Day is coming up December 10th. As always, this is the premier day for Louisiana bred racing, attracting strong competition and the best state bred runners. This event attracts several state legislators so they can see what our industry is about as well as giving our breeders an opportunity to

voice concerns to the lawmakers. I look forward seeing many of you at the races. This year the Race Central Party is moving trackside where we will feature live music as well as food and beverages. Food will be served from 12:00-3:00 p.m. and Rick Mocklin and Southern Voice Band will entertain from 3:00-6:00 p.m. Bring your friends! Bring your family! Everyone is sure to have a great time.

I encourage everyone to be actively involved in all aspects of our industry. Come to a board meeting; be informed and involved. We at the LTBA are doing all we can to be of service to you, the breeders. If you have any questions about our program, the staff in our office at Fair Grounds is happy to help. I personally am always happy to hear from you, especially with suggestions for improving our program.

LOUISIANA TOBA BREEDER OF THE YEAR

P. Dale Ladner & Brett Brinkman

The partnership of P. Dale Ladner and Brett Brinkman, breeders of 2021 Louisiana Horse of the Year Cilla have been named Louisiana TOBA breeders of the year by the LTBA Board of Directors and were honored at the TOBA Awards Banquet, September 10th at Keeneland.

The same connections both bred Cilla and raced her dam, Sittin at the Bar. Ladner purchased the 2010 Into Mischief-Fast Laner filly

through the 2011 Breeders Sales Company of Louisiana Yearling Sale for \$30,000, while he was fortuitously sitting at the bar!

Trained for Ladner by Brinkman, Sittin at the Bar won 11 of 19 starts including nine Louisiana-bred stakes during her career earning \$705,896. She was the 2012 Accredited Louisiana Bred Champion Two-Year-Old Filly, 2013 Accredited Louisiana Bred Champion Three-Year-Old Filly,

and 2014 Accredited Louisiana Bred Champion Four-Year-Old and Upwards Filly or Mare.

Sittin At The Bar has produced four runners, all winners with combined earnings of \$1,390,025 to date. In addition to Cilla, she has produced graded placed stakes winner Club Car, and stakes winner Jack The Umpire.

Cilla was both the first North American, winner and first black type winner for her sire two time Horse of the Year, California Chrome.

Cilla, is proof positive that Louisiana-breds can compete among top company anywhere. At two, she ran third in the 2020 G1 Frizette S. at Belmont. At three, she won the 2021 Louisiana Legends Mademoiselle at Evangeline Downs in June, then took her show on the road to Monmouth Park where she annexed the Blue Sparkler Stakes getting the five and a half furlongs in 1:03.07 to win by 2 1/2 lengths. Next, Cilla won the G2 Prioress S. at Saratoga, running the six furlongs in 1:10.05, defeating Kentucky bred G3 Stakes Winner Souper Sensational.

In 2022, she has added stakes wins in the Orleans S. and LA Bred Premier Matron, both run at Delta Downs. Cilla's current lifetime earnings are \$509,000.

Lovin' Louisiana

Kentuckian Chester Thomas is bullish on Louisiana breeding and racing, and he's bringing in a new stallion to the state to prove it

Horse racing is embedded in the soul of many native Kentuckians, and that's certainly the case with Chester Thomas. His passion for the sport started as a child going to the races with his father in the Bluegrass State, and he's proud to be from Kentucky and loves breeding and racing his horses there. But Louisiana completes the exacta for his favorite racing states, as Thomas has enjoyed great success with his Louisiana-breds and now is stepping up to stand his first stallion in the state with Mr. Money.

Thomas got into owning racehorses as many others did by racing lower-level stock in partnership with a friend. But in a relatively short time, Thomas and his Allied

Racing Stable have reached heights that few have achieved. He's campaigned two multiple graded stakes

winners and sent horses to the Kentucky Derby in consecutive years. At last year's LTBA Annual Awards Banquet, his homebred Who Took the Money was honored as champion 3-year-old colt or gelding and Allied Racing Stable was recognized as the leading breeder by percentage of stakes winners.

Thomas, who is involved in the oil and gas industry, has only been racing horses for about 15 years, and the last several have been an especially fruitful run.

His two biggest horses to date—Mr. Money and By My Standards—have many similarities. Both were tremendous values at auction, as Mr. Money was a \$130,000 yearling purchase and By My Standards

brought \$150,000 as a 2-year-old in training. Both are sons of Goldencents who were trained by Bret Calhoun and attracted the attention of Spendthrift Farm LLC, which partnered with Thomas while those horses were on the track and have continued that partnership into their stallion careers.

Mr. Money won four consecutive Grade 3 races in 2019 and missed a Grade 1 win by just a neck while finishing second in the \$1-million Pennsylvania Derby. He ran first or second in half of his 18 career starts with a bankroll of \$1,360,430. After spending two seasons in Florida, the 6-year-old stallion will stand at Clear Creek Stud in Folsom, Louisiana, for the 2023 season.

By My Standards won the Grade

2 Twinspires.com Louisiana Derby, also in 2019, and got Thomas to his first Kentucky Derby. He finished 11th in the Run for the Roses, and then he launched a memorable 4-year-old campaign that included three Grade 2 victories, one of which was the New Orleans Classic Stakes at Fair Grounds. All told, By My Standards earned nearly \$2.3 million with seven wins and five seconds from 17 starts. He will be standing his first season at stud at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky.

Mr. Big News, a son of Giant's Causeway, took Thomas back to the Kentucky Derby in 2020 for the Covid-delayed running in September, where he ran a surprising third at 46-1 behind Authentic and Tiz the Law.

With all that success on the

national stage, one might wonder why a native Kentuckian is also breeding and racing in Louisiana and not exclusively in his home state. For Thomas, the answer is simple.

"Compared to other states, we felt like Louisiana stood out and there was an opportunity there as a breeder to not just win races but to also get a nice breeders' award check," he said. "I've done a lot of business in New Orleans and spent a lot of time there and always loved going to Fair Grounds."

Thomas' best Louisiana-bred has been Who Took the Money, a gelding by Street Boss who last year won the Crescent City Derby and Louisiana Champions Day Turf Stakes at Fair Grounds. That earned him the aforementioned Louisiana

champion title, and he’s been just as good this year with two more stakes wins. With eight wins from 12 starts, the 4-year-old has earned nearly \$350,000, not including breeders’ awards.

Thomas is looking forward to seeing more of his Louisiana homebreds on the track, especially now that he is standing Mr. Money in the state after two seasons in Florida.

“He got a lot business the first year; I think we bred 79 mares,” said Thomas. “But I was spending a lot of money hauling mares and babies back and forth to Florida, so it worked out well to send him to Clear Creek. Spendthrift is a partner on the horse with us, and they were all for moving him to Louisiana, especially to a first-class operation like Clear Creek.”

Thomas is also putting his money and his mares behind Mr. Money, as he bred about 20 mares to him in each of those first two seasons and plans to come close to that for the 2023 season.

“What we are seeing out of the babies is that he is stamping them with a lot of leg and balance,” he said about Mr. Money’s first crop of weanlings. “They are starting to

were both awesome racehorses and had really good minds and a lot of class,” he said. “When you look at them both you see they have a lot of leg. They both had that heart and

desire to race. There are a lot of good athletes out there but if they don’t have a good mind then things don’t always work out.”

Every horseman knows that “things don’t always work out” is a common theme in racing, as there are many more ways to lose a race than to win. So Thomas is thankful for the success he’s had, which has come without spending lavishly at sales.

“You get into this game and you have that dream about maybe going to the Kentucky Derby,” he said about his two trips to the sport’s biggest race. “But you never really expect it though, so

when it does come around, you just say, ‘Oh wow, did this really happen?’”

While perhaps not on quite the same level as winning the

Kentucky Derby, Thomas recently enjoyed a big weekend at Delta Downs on October 7-8. First, his homebred multiple stakes winner Winning Romance finished a solid second to graded stakes performer Free Like a Girl in the \$100,000 Magnolia Stakes, and then the following night Who Took the Money took the money in \$100,000 Gold Cup Stakes by more than seven lengths.

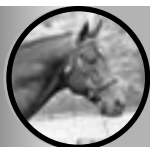
“Those homebreds kind of started our Louisiana-bred program,” said Thomas. “We’ve got some nice 2-year-olds now and are extremely excited about the purse structure for next year. Right now Louisiana is a great place to be and there’s a lot of enthusiasm from horsemen in the state with sports betting money going to purses soon. I don’t know why anyone wouldn’t want to be breeding and racing in Louisiana.”

Thomas has been to the Kentucky Derby twice, won numerous graded stakes and bred a Louisiana champion, but he has another goal for the future: to see a homebred by his stallion Mr. Money in the winner’s circle.

“The first Mr. Money runners will be the running the year after next, so I’m really jacked up and looking forward to racing those horses,” he said. “I get goosebumps just thinking about it.”

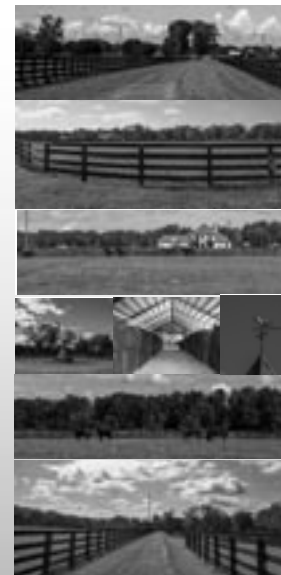

MR. MONEY

There is no questioning Chester Thomas’s faith in the continued growth of the Louisiana state-bred program, or his commitment to Louisiana racing and breeding. That commitment was behind his relocation of his young stallion Mr. Money (owned in partnership with Spendthrift Farm) from Florida’s Journeyman Stud to Clear Creek Stud near Folsom, Louisiana, where Mr. Money will stand the 2023 season for \$4,000 live foal.

The Spendthrift connection to Mr. Money should be no surprise, for the horse is a paternal grandson of Into Mischief, the premier sire at the historic farm. Now closing in on his fourth consecutive sire title, Into Mischief shares the Spendthrift stallion barn with his sons Authentic (the 2020 Horse of the Year), Goldencents, and Maximus Mischief, testifying to Spendthrift’s confidence that Into Mischief will be a successful sire of sires.

Part of that confidence is based on Goldencents, who was among Into Mischief’s earliest top sons to go to stud. A two-time winner of the Breeders’ Cup Dirt Mile (G1), Goldencents also won the 2013 Santa Anita Derby (G1) and set a Del Mar track record of 1:20.99 for seven furlongs on the synthetic surface when winning the 2014 Pat O’Brien Stakes (G2). His resume also includes the 2012 Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (G3) and the 2013 Sham Stakes (G3).

Since his retirement to stud, Goldencents has been the best sire thus far of the stallions that entered stud in 2015. As of October 19, he has 315 winners, 19 stakes winners, and over \$28.5 million in progeny earnings to his credit. In 2021 alone, he was represented by six stakes winners, headed by Rodeo Drive Stakes (G1) winner Going to Vegas.

Mr. Money is a member of Goldencents’ first crop and has a most appropriate name, as he is second only to multiple grade 2 winner By My Standards as a money winner among his sire’s progeny. He is out of Plenty O’Toole, a winning daughter of two-time Breeders’ Cup Classic (G1) winner Tiznow and the Distorted Humor mare O’ Toole. Produced from stakes

winner Well Dressed (by Notebook), O’ Toole is a full sister to 2009 Railbird Stakes (G3) winner Witty (dam of 2021 Daytona Stakes, G3, winner Bombard, by War Front) and a half sister to Well Armed (by Tiznow), the runaway winner of the 2009 Dubai World Cup (G1). In its further reaches, this is the family of two-time Japanese Horse of the Year Symboli Kris S. and 2017 Maker’s 46 Mile Stakes (G1) winner American Patriot.

Blessed with a mix of miler speed and classic stamina in his bloodlines. Mr. Money himself excelled in the range of eight to nine furlongs. The winner of a maiden special weight over a mile and one-sixteenth at Churchill Downs at 2, he was still learning his business when he ran seventh in the 2019 Risen Star Stakes Presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) and fifth in the Twinspires.com Louisiana Derby (G2), getting wide trips both times. His next race was the Pat Day Mile Stakes (G3) on the Kentucky Derby undercard, and this time he showed what he was made of, splitting horses and drawing off to win by 5¼ lengths over next-out Woody Stephens Stakes (G1) winner Hog Creek Hustle; grade 2 winner Instagrاند, future graded stakes winners Last Judgment and Manny Wah, and

next-out Preakness Stakes (G1) runner-up Everfast were in the beaten field.

Mr. Money stayed at Churchill Downs for his next outing, the Matt Winn Stakes (G3), and turned in another fine performance, defeating grade 2 winner Signalman by 6½ lengths in the mile and one-sixteenth race with future Horse of the Year Knicks Go among the also-rans. From there, he went to the Indiana Derby (G3) and the West Virginia Derby (G3), winning both races as an odds-on favorite.

Mr. Money's four-race win streak came to an end in the Pennsylvania Derby (G1), in which he was pressured throughout on the lead and only gave way by a neck in the closing strides; the winner, Math Wizard, had finished behind Mr. Money in both their previous meetings. Mr. Money was hardly disgraced, however; behind him were Preakness Stakes (G1) winner War of Will, grade 1 winner and future champion older male Improbable, and grade 3 winner Spun to Run, who would later win the 2019 Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) with Mr Money seventh in a much duller effort.

For a horse that had been racing steadily since February, that was probably one trip to the well too many, and Mr. Money struggled as a 4-year-old. He lost four straight before picking up his last stakes win in the 2020 Ack Ack Stakes (G3), in which he clipped off a mile in a brisk 1:34.85. After a second unplaced finish in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, he retired to begin his stallion career in 2021, having won six of 18 starts with earnings of \$1,360,430.

A handsome, well-balanced, correct horse with the strong body typical of Into Mischief and his progeny,



Mr. Money appears to have stamped his first crop of Florida-bred foals with his own physique. He was well supported by Thomas, who sent 24 mares to him in 2021 and 20 in 2022, and his first crop will come to the races in 2024.

On pedigree, Mr. Money should cross well with mares from the male lines of Danzig, Awesome Again, Gone West, and Storm Cat, and may also suit mares by Tapit and his sons. In addition, mares tracing to the Fappiano branch of Mr. Prospector (which includes Unbridled's Song and Quiet American) or tracing to Mr. Prospector through daughters may also be worth consideration. Like his sire and grandsire, he is an intermediate physical type that should suit a wide variety of mares, and he has the potential to sire two-turn horses with the right mates as well as speedier types—all in all, an attractive package for breeders in the Pelican State.

TRAVELING MAN

Mike Whitler Travels all over the state for his job as Inspector for the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association

Mike Whitler is a traveling man. He enjoys the open road and all the people he meets along the way in his position as the horse inspector for the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association. Life enjoyed through the “windshield” as Whitler calls it suits him, and so do all the friendships he has made within the Louisiana horse community throughout the fourteen years that he has held the position.

“The best thing about this job are all the people I meet,” said Whitler, who resides in Shreveport. “I have developed some great friendships through the



years, and that is what I treasure the most. I have traveled to all the farms in Louisiana, from north to south, and enjoy the differences in the people and the culture.”

Whitler travels to farms throughout the state to inspect mares for their presence in Louisiana as part of the Louisiana-bred program that requires mares to foal in the state so that their offspring are registered Louisiana bred.

“Mares that leave the state during breeding season must return to foal in Louisiana by August 1,” said Whitler. “The offspring from these mares have a great impact on the economy

of Louisiana. The identification of the mares comes primarily from scanning them for a microchip which confirms who they are. Other methods of identification that I use include markings and tattoos. A tattoo fades with time and not every mare has raced, so a microchip is the most consistent method of identification.”

Whitler has had many adventures throughout his career and said that many times people are not prepared when he arrives unannounced to identify their mares.

“Horse people are busy people, and there is never a good time,” Whitler stated. “Sometimes I call and can never get anyone to confirm a day or time, so as a result many times I just show up—the job must get done and I can bide my time and wait until they get done with the blacksmith or the vet. I am always friendly and cordial, but persistent.”

Whitler does not wear a suit and tie or drive a company car. Inspecting mares is primarily an outside job and requires boots and a vehicle that can plow through whatever mother nature has in store on any given day.

“I drive an Outback and wear good boots,” Whitler said. “Sometimes mares are not easily accessible, and you may have to drive or walk-through muddy fields to get to them. Not everyone has a manicured farm, and sometimes the location is rather remote. You might walk out into the field and the mares aren’t wearing a halter, are hard to catch, or somewhere else. You just don’t know what type of situation that you are walking into sometimes.”

One thing that Whitler noted about horse people is that they love to talk.

“I am on the frontlines with all these horse people who live rather

secluded lives,” he said. “Many have an opinion about everything and everyone in the horse business and would like nothing more than for me to share my opinion. That is one thing that I absolutely do not do—express my opinions in these conversations. I am not paid to share my opinion.”

Whitler doesn’t have much time for outside hobbies but does have a four-year-old Thoroughbred currently racing and a two-year-old that has yet to start.

“I do have a little skin in the game,” he said. “I am looking forward to the two-year-old making it to the races and enjoy watching the older horse compete. There isn’t any time to hunt, fish or play golf. I am always on the road serving the horse community and really enjoy my job, the people, and wherever the road leads.”

Louisiana held its 2022 Yearling Sale followed by Mixed Session, Saturday, October 1st at the Equine Sales Facility in Opelousas. The weather was glorious and the consignors' barns were buzzing with activity before the 10:00 am start.

138 yearlings were cataloged with 18 outs. 101 yearlings sold for a gross of \$1,690,600 nearly doubling the 2021 gross of \$898,000. The yearling average was \$16,739 with a median of \$10,000 another significant increase over 2021 average \$13,027 and median \$8,000.

Three weanlings sold for a gross of \$20,000 and an average of \$6,667. One horse of racing age sold for \$7,000. Nine broodmares sold for a gross of \$67,800 and an average of \$7,530.

The gross for the overall sale was \$1,785,400.

Hip number 60, out of the Brehon Farm consignment topped the sale bringing down the hammer at \$63,000. The colt, by Cupid, who is among the leading second crop sires in North America, is out of Bronze Abe, a multiple stakes win-

ning stakes producing Two Punch mare, and was purchased by Mintmere.

Hip number 23, out of the Clear Creek Stud consignment, was purchased by Valene Farms for \$62,000, the second highest price of the day. The dkbb colt is by the

late stallion Half Ours, a four time leading Louisiana Stallion out of the multiple stakes winning Louisiana bred mare Smitty's Sunshine, and is a full brother to multiple stakes winner Smitty's Cougar.

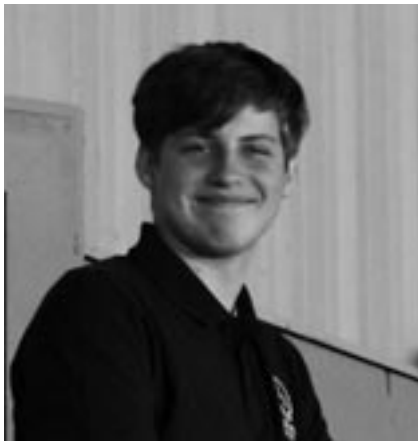

TENDON AND TENDON SHEATH INJURIES

Horses in strenuous athletic careers are often injured by stress and strain on leg structures. Soft tissue injuries (tendons and ligaments) often take the longest time to heal. Dr. Mark Cassells (Homestead Veterinary Hospital, Villa Ridge, Missouri) has been practicing for more than 20 years, and says one of the best things that has happened in those years is improvement in our ability to catch tendon injuries early, with ultrasound.

“The ultrasound technology and equipment has gotten better every year, so we are able to pick up subtle lesions earlier than we could before. We can catch them before there is so much damage,” he says.

“The other benefit is that we can monitor these lesions with ultrasound after treatment, to see how they are doing. The treatment might be regenerative therapy with stem cells, PRP etc. We can monitor that lesion with better accuracy and see how it’s healing—much better than we could 10 or 15 years ago,” he explains.

Another reason he likes to use ultrasound is that when a horse is put into a rehabilitation program and you start increasing the work load, the tendon can be readily monitored. “Even though the horse may be performing well and is acting ok, we still need to see how the structure is handling the work. Is the tendon holding up or are we starting to see more signs of lesions?” Ultrasound is one way to make sure that the horse is

not being pushed too hard. This just gives a person more confidence about stepping up to the next level. You are always walking a fine line, trying to strengthen the structure as it heals, rather than tearing it down.

Tendons are attached to muscles—attaching the muscle to the bone. If you can keep the muscles strong, and keep everything strong around that tendon, this gives the tendon more support. Many tendon injuries are due to fatigue when the horse is working. When the muscles get tired, the tendons take more load and more stress. If you can keep the horse fit and the muscles strong, there’s less risk for tendon injury. And when coming back from an injury, you want to rehab the horse with controlled exercise, rather than letting the horse run and buck and possibly reinjure that tendon.

“If you have the option of keeping the horse in a stall and gradually increasing the exercise with hand-walking, treadmills, etc. this is helpful. Controlled is the key word. You can’t just give the horse 4 months of rest and then suddenly go back to work. There needs to be a program that fits the horse and the situation the horse is in, and the rider’s level of capability. Some owners and riders can handle the rehabilitation program very well and some cannot, partly because the overactive horse is not helping itself. When you take that horse out of the stall, it wants to run and buck, and lunging is not

recommended for rehab in tendon repair. The important thing is safety first—for the rider, the handler, and the horse. It doesn’t do anyone any good if the rider get bucked off and the horse is running around in the pen as fast as it can,” he says.

It is important, however, to keep the horse in some type of exercise, whether hand walking or tack walking a couple times a day—getting the horse outside of the stall multiple times. This helps the horse mentally as well as physically and keeps the muscles stronger. “If it’s a novel experience for the horse to go outside the stall, the horse will go crazy, so you need to utilize some form of controlled exercise, and ultrasound is a great tool for establishing and monitoring a rehabilitation program,” says Cassells.

Every horse is different. “Some heal faster than others, but typically tendon injuries take 6 to 8 months, if not longer, to get back to a full level of work. Tendons take longer than bones to heal, and the rule of thumb adage is that it takes one month per letter. Bone takes 4 months to heal, tendons take 6 months and ligaments 8 months. It’s an easy way to remember it, and ligaments are the slowest to heal—because there is less blood supply to a ligament. The tendon at least has the muscle fibers with blood in them, at that end. It varies, of course, depending on where the injury is. If it’s up near the muscle it might heal

faster than if it's in the middle of the tendon where there is no blood supply.”

The treatment for a tendon injury is based on the lesion—whether it is a large core lesion or just a strain with mild thickening or if there is a lot of thickening. “If there is a large lesion, I generally prefer to use regenerative therapy such as stem cells or PRP. If there's scar tissue and the lesion is old, I like to use shock wave therapy to help break up the scar tissue and stimulate blood flow. Shock wave therapy can be very nice to use because it is non-invasive, very safe, and relatively inexpensive compared to

some other treatments. It can also be done multiple times throughout a horse's career,” he says.

Laser therapy has also been shown to be effective, but Cassells feels that the best thing to use in a horse with a fresh injury is ice. “Treating a fresh injury with cold will slow down the inflammation and swelling. Using cold therapy (ice or ice boots) for 48 to 72 hours after an injury and then applying bandages with a poultice to try to reduce inflammation can be very effective. The more you can reduce the inflammation in a fresh injury, the better and faster it will heal,” he explains.

It's also important to identify a problem quickly. Most trainers make a habit of checking and feeling the horses' legs, after a workout, the next day after a race or workout, etc. to see if there is any heat or swelling. “In a racehorse, a fresh tendon injury can be fairly easy to see, compared to a jumper. In those horses we more often have to deal with a gradual, chronic breakdown. When you get 6 months into it you realize what's gone wrong but you are already behind the 8-ball.”

Mr. Money relocates to Louisiana's Clear Creek Stud



Owner Chester Thomas is following the money: In this case, moving his five-time graded-stakes winner Mr. Money as a stallion from Florida to Louisiana's Clear Creek Stud for the 2023 breeding season.

Thomas bred 24 mares to Mr. Money in 2021, with 16 foaling in Louisiana this year while they also remain eligible for Florida's stallion stakes series. Thomas bred 20 mares to Mr. Money this breeding season.

Spendthrift Farm also is a partner in Mr. Money.

A fan of the Louisiana breeding program and racing in the Pelican State, Thomas decided to go all in by relocating Mr. Money to Clear Creek Stud near Folsom. With the breeding industry getting revenue from the state's legalized sports wagering, the purses for Louisiana-foaled and Louisiana-sired horses are expected to explode. In addition, historical horse racing gaming terminals, which are being installed

at tracks and their off-track-betting facilities, will boost purses for all horses racing in the state.

"I just really like the way the Louisiana program is heading," said Thomas. "I think Mr. Money has everything it takes to be a successful sire, and I believe having him at a top farm in a growing regional market gives him the best chance to show what he can do. Most of my horses race in New Orleans in the winter anyway, and I'm sure going to have a lot of Louisiana-bred Mr. Money babies. I thought I might just as well take advantage of having Louisiana-sired as well as Louisiana-born Mr. Moneys.

"We think he will excel in Louisiana. They have one of the best — if not the best — breeding programs outside of Kentucky. I'm hoping a lot of people cash in on Mr. Money in Louisiana, me included. It's exciting to have him there with such good people as those at Clear Creek."

Mr. Money, out of the Tiznow mare Plenty O'Toole, is the son of two-time Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Goldencents and grandson of Into Mischief. He won six of 18 starts, including the Grade 3 quintet of the Pat Day Mile, Matt Winn, Indiana Derby and West Virginia Derby as a 3-year-old and Churchill Downs' Ack Ack at 4. Mr. Money's earnings of \$1.36 million include finishing second by a neck in the Grade 1 Pennsylvania Derby. He was fourth in the 2018 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs off of his maiden victory.

Among the horses that Mr. Money defeated on the racetrack were future Horse of the Year Knicks Go, Preakness winner War of Will and Grade 1 winners Improbable, Spun to Run, Mind Control, Math Wizard and Hog Creek Hustle.

"Mr. Money was an unbelievable racehorse," Thomas said. "His babies are coming out and are looking like stone-cold runners. They've got a lot of leg and their physicals are unbelievable. I'm very, very excited with what we're seeing."

Mr. Money's third-year stud fee will be \$3,500 if paid by Sept. 1 or \$4,000 live foal. A limited number of lifetime breeding rights are available.

Fair Grounds Announces 12 New Stakes Earlier Opening for 22-23 TB Racing Season

Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots has announced that 65 stakes worth a combined \$8.5 million, up more than \$700,000 from last season, will be offered during the 80-day, 2022-23 Thoroughbred meet. In each of the 13 unrestricted, non-graded stakes, purses have been increased by \$25,000. In addition,

twelve new Louisiana-bred stakes have been added to the schedule, including six over the first two days of the meet.

"We worked with the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association and Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association to come up with these new stakes," said Fair Grounds' racing secretary Scott Jones. "We're proud to have worked together for the betterment of our sport to create not only the best stakes schedule, but also the richest program we've ever offered in the state."

The traditional Thanksgiving opening will give way to an earlier start to the meet, with opening day

slated for Friday, November 18. Six inaugural \$75,000 Louisiana-bred stakes will be run over the dirt course on the season's first two days. Fillies and mares take center stage on Friday in the Happy Ticket Stakes (6 furlongs) and the Big World Stakes (1 mile & 70 yards), both for 3-year-olds and up. The Donovan L. Ferguson Memorial Stakes, a 5 1/2 furlong event for 2-year-olds, will also be carded on opening day. Saturday's trio of stakes are a mirror-image in terms of age, distance and surface, but these open Louisiana-bred events are highlighted by a 6-furlong dirt sprint named in honor of Ivory Sisters Racing's multiple stakes

winning, fan favorite Monte Man, who retired from racing last year.

“Coming off a very successful 150th anniversary season we can’t wait to welcome fans back to experience the best winter racing in New Orleans starting in November,” said Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots’ president Doug Shipley. “We have made significant investments at the track which includes our new \$1.5 million dollar state-of-the-art Tote board. The new board is one of the best in the country and provides an unparalleled experience.”

Louisiana Champions Day presented by Acadian Ambulance will be held on December 10. With the races run in various divisions over a variety of distances on both dirt and turf, the program features nine stakes restricted to Louisiana-

breeds. Each Louisiana Champions Day stakes is worth \$100,000 with the exception of the \$150,000 Louisiana Champions Day Classic and the two new additions – the \$50,000 Louisiana Champions Day Starter and \$50,000 Louisiana Champions Day Ladies Starter, both of which will be run at 5 1/2 furlongs for 3-year-olds and up.

“This isn’t the first time we’ve started early,” Scott Jones said. “It means less five-day weeks for us during the entirety of the meet and gives us the opportunity to run multiple preps for Louisiana Champions Day on December 10. Starting on Thanksgiving only gave us 16 days to Champions Day. Of course we will still have the Thanksgiving Classic, a fantastic day of racing, and a festive crowd, as is the New Orleans tradition.”

Three other stakes will make their debut in 2023, most notably on January 7 the \$75,000 Gary P. Palmisano Memorial Stakes. Paired with the \$75,000 Bob F. Wright Memorial Stakes for fillies and mares, both 6-furlong dirt sprints are for 4-year-olds and up. A longtime Louisiana trainer and most recently the paddock judge at Fair Grounds, Gary Palmisano, Sr., who passed away last December, was a beloved member of the local racing community.

Also added to the Fair Grounds’ stakes program are the \$75,000 Louisiana Stallion of the Year Half Ours Stakes at 1 mile 70 yards and the \$75,000 Louisiana Broodmare of the Year Buttercup’s Song Stakes at one mile – both written for 3-year-old Louisiana-breds and named for two of the great produc-

ing influences in Louisiana's breeding history. Half Ours sired 22 stakes winners, but his reign came to an untimely end after a freak paddock accident in July of 2021. With twelve foals and nine starters, the earnings of Buttercup's Song's foals totaled \$1,721,518, highlighted by Pound for Pound and the graded-stakes winner Flatlined. Those stakes will be contested on February 25.

The 80-day, 2022-2023 Fair Grounds racing season runs through Sunday, March 26. Regular post time will be 1:05 p.m. CT, but opening day post time is 3:00 p.m. CT. There will be an earlier noon CT first post on Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 24), Louisiana Champions Day (Dec. 10), Road to the Derby Kickoff Day (Dec. 26), Road to the Derby Day (Jan. 21) Louisiana

Derby Preview Day (Feb. 18), and Louisiana Derby Day (March 25).

Fair Grounds Lowers Pick 5 Takeout Introduces New Pick 6

With the approval of the Louisiana State Racing Commission handed down October 26th, Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots announces two horseplayer-friendly adjustments to the 2022-23 wagering menu. Takeout will be reduced on the Pick 5 from 25% to 15%. Also, a new Pick 6 at the same 15% rate will be added.

Takeout is the percentage of every wagering dollar removed before payoffs are calculated.


Racing officials at Churchill Downs Incorporated ("CDI") and Fair Grounds have been studying successes at other tracks and work-

ing to make this change at Fair Grounds.

"We are very excited about both of these new wagering opportunities," said Gary Palmisano Jr., the Executive Director of Racing for CDI. "Fair Grounds has not had a Pick 6 in many years. After monitoring the success of this same wager at the New York Racing Association, we feel this is an interesting variation of the pool to implement and worth exploring."

Fair Grounds offers a traditional Pick 5 where the entire pool, after the 15% takeout, is paid out to winning bettors. If there are no perfect Pick Five tickets, the entire pool, minus the takeout, will carry over to the late Pick Five the next racing day. On most racing days there will be two Pick Five opportunities for horseplayers – an early and a late –

and on cards of 11 races or more, a third may be added.

The new Pick 6 wager will have a \$1 minimum wager. It will be “non-jackpot” and 75% of the after-takeout pool will be paid to all tickets with 6 winners. The other 25% will be paid to all those with 5 of 6 winners as a consolation. If no one has 6 winners, then 75% goes to the next day as a carryover and 25% is paid to all the consolation tickets.

“The obvious goal is that this wager will create numerous carry-over opportunities and draw attention to racing in New Orleans,” Palmisano Jr. added.

The 80-day, 2022-2023 Fair Grounds racing season opens on Friday, November 18 and runs through Sunday, March 26. Regular post time will be 1:05 p.m. CT, but opening day post time is 3:00 p.m. CT. Sixty-five stakes worth a combined \$8.5 million, up more than \$700,000 from last season, will be offered during the Thoroughbred meet.

Free Like A Girl Runs Second in \$500,000 G3 Charles Town Oaks

2021 Louisiana Bred Champion Two-Year-Old Filly ran second in the \$500,000 G3 Charles Town Oaks on Friday, August 26. The three-year-old filly from the first crop of Louisiana sire El Deal pressed the front runner through a :23.28 first quarter and :46.54 half, before Society opened up to win the 7 furlong contest.

The graded contest boosted Free Like A Girl's earnings to \$562,128 with a current record of 16-8-4-3, with all but one of her wins coming from stakes victories. All three of her 2022 wins were in Louisiana-

bred stakes contests. In addition to the Charles Town Oaks, Free Like a Girl ran third in the 2022 \$225,000 G3 Iowa Oaks.

Bred in Louisiana by Kim Renee Stover and Lisa Osborne, Free Like A Girl is out of a Flashy Bull mare, Flashy Prize. Her sire, El Deal stands at Red River Farms in Coushatta, Louisiana and is currently the leading second crop sire in the state.

Judge Rules CDI Can Ban Broberg From FG Over Alleged Neglect

Last September, Churchill Downs, Inc. banned trainer Karl Broberg from the entry box at its parent company's racetracks after an incident involving a voided claim led to what CDI alleged as neglect.

When racing began at the CDI-owned Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans, La., however, the Louisiana Racing Commission insisted that only state racing stewards could legally exclude Broberg from racing. Commission chair Benjamin Guilbeau argued that since the Kentucky commission did not take action against Broberg, the trainer's license remained in good standing.

A year later, reports nola.com, District Judge Robin Giarrusso has ruled that CDI does have the right to exclude Broberg from its properties, including Fair Grounds. In addition, the judge has sent the alleged neglect case to the stewards so that Broberg can argue it in front of them.

The case stems from the post-race treatment of a horse Broberg started at Churchill Downs on Sept. 18, 2021.

According to a CDI statement at that time: On the night of Sept. 18, Karl Broberg's Rockandahardplace finished sixth of seven in a \$10,000 claiming race at Churchill Downs. A claim for the 5-year-old gelding was voided after the race by rule when the horse was declared lame by a KHRC veterinarian at the test barn. The horse was returned to his stall by a paid hotwalker, but a subsequent investigation revealed that there was no responsible representative of the trainer on-site to make veterinary decisions or to take appropriate steps to protect the welfare of the injured horse.

For his part, Broberg disputes Churchill's assertion that he did not have proper care available to the horse.

Broberg has been ranked first or second in North American trainer standings by wins each year since 2013, and has amassed 4,119 victories from 17,091 starts since he began training in 2009. His business model depends on keeping strings of horses in multiple states and relies heavily on claiming races. He is currently ranked ninth in North America by earnings and second by wins.

Lozada, Wilson and End Zone Athletics, Inc. 2022 Louisiana Downs TB Meet Winners

The 2022 Thoroughbred racing season at Louisiana Downs concluded on Tuesday, September 27. The meet leaders, jockey Carlos Lozada, trainer Shane Wilson and owner End Zone Athletics, Inc. were honored for their accomplishments on the final afternoon of the 84-day meet, which began on Saturday, May 7.

Carlos Lozada, who won his first title here in 2019, clinched top honors once again. He was involved in a competitive battle with Jose Guerrero entering the final week of the season, but drew off by five wins. Lozada capped his meet by winning the final race of the meet aboard Super Wise (\$20.40) on the turf for trainer Al Cates.

Lozada was the leading rider here in 2019 and secured the 2021 title with 84 wins. He rode for a variety of trainers including Greg Tracy, Joe Duhon, Joey Foster, Al Cates and Karl Broberg, completing the 2022 meet with a record of 85 wins, 59 seconds and 61 third-place finishes. His mounts earned \$1,097,345.

Jose Guerrero had an excellent meet, winning 80 races and edging Lozada in earnings with \$1,144,805. Joel Dominguez, who was second in the standings in 2021, finished third with 59 trips to the winner's circle. Apprentice Vicente Del-Cid, winner of the 2022 Evangeline Downs leading rider title, was fourth in the standings with 52 victories.

It was another excellent showing for Shane Wilson who repeated as leading trainer at Louisiana Downs with 50 victories.

The Haughton, Louisiana resident started 217 Thoroughbreds adding 42 runner-up finishes and 33 thirds to earn \$762,665 for the meet. He took the lead from the beginning of the meet and was never caught.

Joey Foster, who has won the Louisiana Downs trainer title three times, finished in a tie for second with Karl Broberg. Both horsemen won 38 races. Greg Tracy followed with 30 victories and Steve

Asmussen won 28 races.

End Zone Athletics, Inc. claimed its third leading owner title. The highly successful partnership of Karl Broberg and Matt Johanson won 21 races this meet, after topping the standings in 2019 and 2020, and finishing second last year to Wayne T. Davis.

Davis, who won the 2021 title, finished in a tie for second with Greg Tracy. Both owners won 15 races. Elite Thoroughbred Racing, Inc. rounded out the top four in the standings with 12 wins.

Louisiana Downs 2023 Dates Approved

The 2023 Quarter Horse racing season at Louisiana Downs will commence on Thursday, January 5 and continue through Saturday, April 1. The dates for both the 46-day Quarter Horse meet and 2023 Thoroughbred live racing season were approved by the Louisiana State Racing Commission (LSRC) on August 23.

Opening day for the 84-day Thoroughbred meet will be Saturday, May 6 and will conclude on Tuesday, September 26. Live racing will take place Saturday through Tuesday.

LAD Photog Lou Hodges, Jr. Passes The Torch To Ann Switalski

Since 2005, photographer Lou Hodges, Jr. has captured the excitement and beauty of horse racing at Louisiana Downs. On the final day of the 2022 Thoroughbred racing season, he officially passed the baton to his highly respected assistant Ann Switalski.

Lou Hodges, Jr. served as track photographer at several racetracks,

including Rockingham Park, Washington Park and Arlington Park. His father, Lou Hodges was the official photographer at Fair Grounds in New Orleans beginning in 1948, before his son took over in 1976.

In addition to being the official photographer at Fair Grounds, Hodges Photography also has the contract at Louisiana Downs.

Ann McKnight Switalski was born in Saginaw, Michigan. She arrived in Louisiana in 2003 and stayed after her husband retired from the military. An avid equestrienne, she began taking photos of morning works and soon realized that an investment in a quality camera was essential. Hodges offered her an opportunity to shoot some Super Derby action and hired her in 2016.

"I was very fortunate to find Ann," explained Hodges. "She was working for a veterinarian on the backside and was interested in photography. I met with her and noticed right away that she was very creative and asked her to come to work."

With no previous background in photography, Switalski realized she had a lot to learn, and with the expert guidance of Hodges, she jumped right in.

"Lou made sure I understood that there is a very limited time to get the shots we need: the stretch, wire and comeback," said Switalski. "He taught me the importance of getting the horse in front to allow room for editing."

Switalski enjoys the people involved in both Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racing and getting memorable shots of jockeys as they jog back after a tough finish.

“Maria Baca gave me a very nice compliment,” said Switalski. “She said that no one takes photos of the riders like I do and that her mother loves them!”

On the final day of the 2022 racing season, Louisiana Downs officials honored Hodges for his service and presented him with a plaque thanking him for his excellence.

“Hodges Photography has been an integral part of the history of Louisiana Downs,” said Kevin Preston, the track’s owner and president. “We are grateful for the professionalism of Lou Hodges and the images that will remain with us forever. Ann is greatly admired by our horsemen and everyone in our organization. We know she will do an excellent job!”

“We’re obviously thrilled that a Texas-bred by one of our state’s most influential stallions led the sale,” TTA Director Foster Bridewell said. “She was a beautiful filly and the full sister went through this same sales ring before going on to become a Texas champion. the boys. She was also second in the Coca Cola Classic and the Vinery Matchmaker Stakes and third in the Sangué Handicap. She saved her best for her Six-Year-Old season with four stakes wins that included finally capturing the Sangué Handicap in addition to winning the Furl Sail Handicap, Red Camelia Handicap and finishing the year with a win in the Louisiana Champions Day Ladies. As a Seven-Year-Old she won her third Red Camelia Handicap and was stakes placed in both the Sangué Handicap and the Honeymoon Stakes. In all, Hope List won twenty races from eighty-one starts with twelve seconds and thirteen thirds for earnings of \$601,475 for Owner/Breeder Delmar Caldwell. She was voted Champion Filly Or Mare in both 1995 and 1996.

As a broodmare, Hope List produced twelve foals, all of which raced, with nine winners and one

Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority Submits Prohibited Substances List to the Federal Trade Commission

The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) has submitted to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) a technical document listing and categorizing 1,365 Prohibited Substances covered by HISA's anti-doping and medication control (ADMC) rules and further dividing them into sub-categories of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications. The document is now subject to final approval by the FTC ahead of the ADCM Program's January 1, 2023 implementation date.

This technical document was developed by HISA's ADCM Standing Committee and approved by the Horseracing Integrity & Welfare Unit (HIWU), which will administer the program. In a memorandum to racing participants, HISA ADCM Committee Chair Adolpho Birch summarized the contents of the document submitted, which underwent several modifications based on substantive feedback from racing participants and experts during a public comment period before submission to the FTC.

"The Prohibited Substances List is the result of extensive consultation with industry and subject matter experts and is informed by established research. Once approved by the FTC, it will serve as the backbone of HISA's ADCM Program set to take effect in the New Year," said Birch. "Through

our collective efforts led by the ADCM Committee, we are proud to introduce U.S. Thoroughbred racing's first-ever uniform Prohibited Substances list that will be applied on a national basis to advance integrity, transparency and accountability in the sport."

"Effective anti-doping programs require clear guidance on prohibited substances, and we are pleased with the document that was submitted to the FTC," said Ben Mosier, executive director of HIWU. "This list will play a key role in HIWU's assignment to enforce HISA's ADCM Program, and we are prepared to take on this critical responsibility on behalf of the Thoroughbred industry."

In addition to listing and categorizing all prohibited substances covered by the ADCM Program, the document details detection times, screening limits and thresholds. The modified document submitted to the FTC is available on the HISA website.
