BREEDING SHED

Keeping the Membership informed, LTBA President Warren J. Harang, III

Another successful Louisiana Champions Day is now in the history books. The top Louisiana-bred thoroughbreds and their connections showed up at New Orleans Fair Grounds on a beautiful December day. As always, it was an exciting day of racing, with repeating champions and new rising stars finding the winners circle. You can read about Louisiana Champions Day starting on page 13 of this issue.

The first Accredited Louisiana-bred stakes day of 2023 will be held at Delta Downs, Saturday, February 4th. After two years of issues requiring the races be run during the day, Louisiana Premier Night returns to its original format of night racing. Ten stakes races for Accredited Louisiana-breds with combined purses of \$895,000 are slated to run at the Vinton oval. First post will be 4:50.

With the passing of legislation allowing sports gaming and pari-mutuel historic horse racing in Louisiana, we expected to see purses in the state increasing. We are seeing this in the current Fair Grounds meet with twelve new stakes for Accredited Louisiana Breds worth a total of \$850,000 plus \$50,000 maiden special weights and allowance purses for Accredited Louisiana Breds ranging from \$46-\$52,000. This is only the beginning. There are only a limited number of machines currently

operating. As the number of machines in the OTBs grows to capacity, the numbers will continue going up. This is an exciting time for Louisiana breeding, and I see a prosperous future is on the horizon for all of us.

We have two new advertised stallions in Louisiana. Chester Thomas of Allied Racing Stable, LLC has brought his Mr. Money (Goldcents-Plenty O'Toole, by Tiznow) to Louisiana. The 5 time graded stakes winning millionaire is standing at Clear Creek Stud in Folsom for a fee of \$4,000 LFSN. Dex Comardelle has brought graded stakes winner Rushie (Liam's Map-Conquest Angel, by Colonel John) to his Blue Star Racing in Scott, where he joins Breaking Lucky who has returned to Louisiana after 2 years standing in Florida. Rushie stands for a fee of \$4,000 LFSN.

I would like to commend Val Murrell and the staff of Clear Creek Stud for once again hosting a first class stallion presentation at their farm in December. This annual event showcases our entire industry. As always, several Louisiana lawmakers attended including Commissioner of Agriculture, Dr. Mike Strain, who is always an exceptional ally to Louisiana horsemen and women. Much work and many resources are involved to put on such an event, and I thank Val and his staff for providing us this

platform to keep our industry in the forefront of state leaders and giving us the opportunity to communicate with them directly.

At the most recent LTBA Board of Directors meeting, the Louisiana Future Farmers of America (FFA) brought a delegation of student officers and members to familiarize the LTBA with the FFA program. The students all presented themselves in the most professional manner. They were all very well spoken and many already have equine experience, whether through school or working on a family farm. These young people are the future of our industry, and if the FFA students that were present are representative of the whole, our future is in good hands. We hope to have a positive reciprocal relationship with this organization going into the future.

I encourage everyone to be actively involved in all aspects of our industry. Come to a board meeting; be informed and involved. We at the LTBA are doing all we can to be of service to you, the breeders. If you have any questions about our program, the staff in our office at Fair Grounds is happy to help. I personally am always happy to hear from you, especially with suggestions for improving our program.

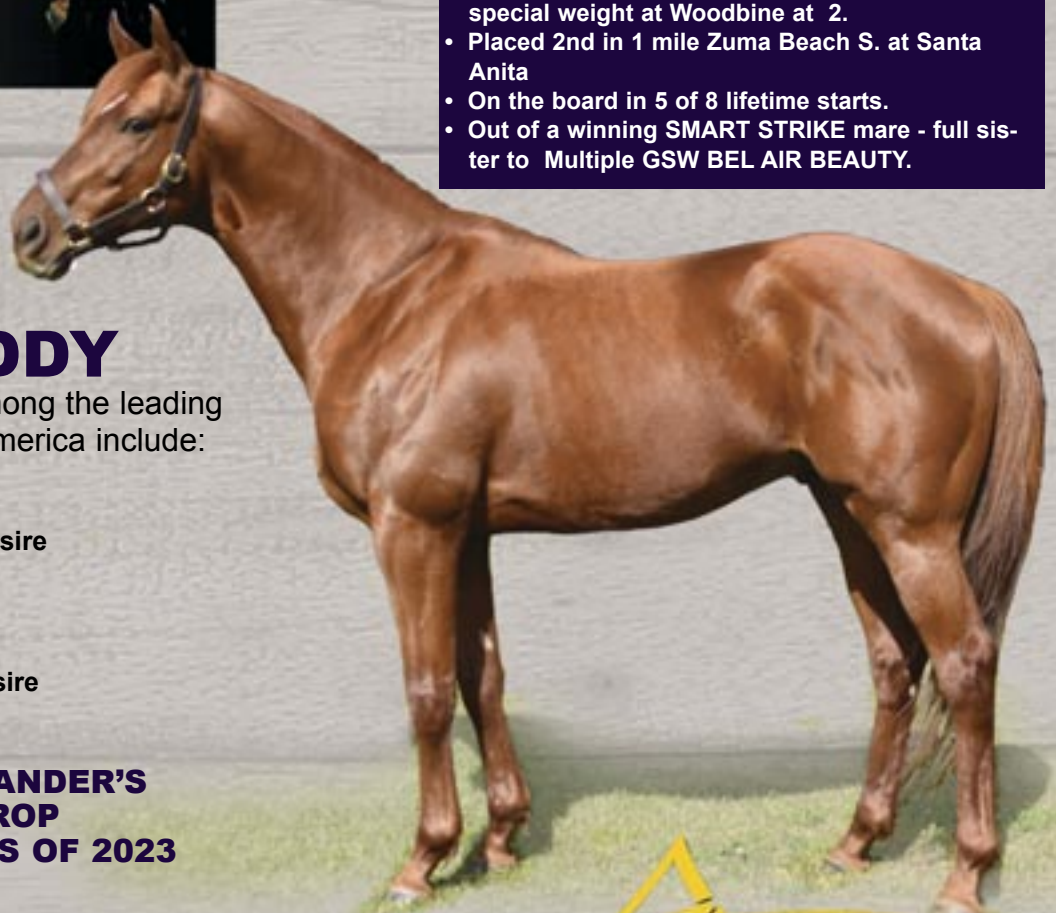

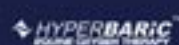

2022 LOUISIANA FUTURITIES

The 60th edition of the Louisiana Futurities is in the books. Although the Fair Grounds program listed them as the 59th edition, since the Louisiana Futurities began in 1963 and go through 2022 that makes this the 60th (although the fillies didn't have their own division until 1965). The day started our overcast but comfortable so the Filly Division, run as the second race on the card was run under cloudy skies. By the time the Colt and Gelding Division was run as the ninth race the skies had cleared and it was a comfortable day at the races for the crowd that came to close out 2022 at the Fair Grounds

FILLY DIVISION

NORAH G

**(Fast Anna-Mr. G's Moonshine)
Breeder/Owner – Thomas Galvin**

Thomas Galvin's Norah G, having just failed to catch Free Drop Maddy in the Louisiana Champions Day Lassie was the morning line favorite in the Filly Division of the Louisiana Futurity. By the time they entered the gate Norah G had been bet down to .30 to a dollar.

She did not disappoint as she stalked the early leaders, took the lead in the stretch and held off the fast closing Everlyn's Angel to secure the win while getting the six furlongs in 1:14.93 on the deep surface that was rated good for the day.

Norah G is the first stakes winner produced by her dam, Mr. G's Moonshine, who has produced six starters from seven foals and all are winners. A homebred for Thomas Galvin, Norah G is trained by Patricia West. This is the same team that captured the Louisiana Champions Day Distaff this year.

Norah G has now earned \$110,000 from just three starts with a stakes win a stakes placing and a Maiden Special Weights victory.

COLT & GELDING DIVISION

JACK HAMMER

In the Colt & Gelding Division it was once again the favorite who breezed his way into the winner's circle when Allied Racing's Jack Hammer won by a comfortable two plus lengths. Breaking from the six post position in the seven horse field, Jack Hammer quickly found his stride and briefly stalked the pace of Z Resurrection while racing wide. He took command in the turn then went wide into the stretch but finished gamely to the wire.

Jack Hammer is the second stakes winner and third stakes horse produced by his dam, Lipstick Junkie, who previously produced Winning Romance, a three time stakes winner and seven times stakes placed runner, and the stakes placed winner of \$238,617 Davidic Line. The mare has a Two-Year-Old of 2023 by Half Ours, a yearling by First Samurai and was bred to Mr. Money for a 2023 foal.

With two wins from two starts, Jack Hammer, trained by leading Fair Grounds currently leading trainer, Bret Calhoun, has now earned \$90,000 after having previously won a Maiden Special Weights race opening weekend at the Fair Grounds.

STARS ALIGN FOR DELHOMME FAMILY WITH TOUCHUPONASTAR

The stars were out on Saturday Dec. 10 at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots for the 32nd annual Louisiana Champions Day.

The brightest one was undoubtedly \$150,000 Classic winner Touchuponastar, who established a new stakes record with a front-

running score under Tim Thornton for the Delhomme family operation Set-Hut LLC.

Thornton allowed Touchuponastar to use his speed to open up an easy lead through comfortable fractions of 24.55 and 49.34 for the half-mile. Thornton stayed

patient as Behemah Star made his run to get just about on even terms as the horses straightened away down the long Fair Grounds stretch.

Touchuponastar responded to some urging to quickly open back up by as many as six lengths in the

lane cruising under the wire in 1:50.66. Behemah Star did hold second 4-¾-lengths back.

“He’s a horse we’ve been extremely high on since the beginning,” said Delhomme, who had cross-entered him in both the Classic and the Sprint. “He’s so versatile. We would have felt just as confident in the Sprint but we wanted to test him in the Classic

and keep him two turns and he showed up and rewarded us.”

Trained by Jeff Delhomme, Touchuponastar became the first son of his three-time Classic winning father, Star Guitar, to win the marquee event for older horses. Star Guitar was a three-time Classic winner (2009-11). Touchuponastar, out of the Lion Heart mare Touch Magic bred in

Louisiana by Coteau Grove Farms, now owns a gaudy 6-4-1-1 record good for \$163,100 in earnings.

Delhomme did not rule out the chance of testing his barn star against open company in the future.

“He’s run some crazy numbers so far, he’s a gelding and to be honest I want to have him around for a long time,” Delhomme said. “Will we step out in open company at some point? Who knows. I certainly see that. When and where I’m not so sure yet.”

Allied Racing’s Who Took the Money, the reigning 2021 Champion Louisiana-bred 3-year-old colt, entered the Classic on a three-race win streak trying to become the first horse to win both the Classic and the Turf in his career.

Sent off as the heavy .50-to-1 favorite, the Chester Thomas homebred settled sixth in the seven-horse field but could only muster a non-threatening third with his closing kick under Deshawn Parker.

“We knew going in he would need a bit of a set up to run his best,” trainer Bret Calhoun said. “We have been getting away running him on the dirt even though we think he is a much better turf horse. Take nothing away from the winner; he’s a nice horse.”

Cosmic Train, Highland Creek and Maga Man completed the order of finish. Beauregard was scratched.

LATE SEPTEMBER IMPRESSES

Late September survived a claim of foul to give trainer Jose Camejo his first of two Louisiana Champions Day wins on the card in the \$100,000 Juvenile Stakes.

Late September broke sharp but shifted inward from the seven-hole under jockey Jose Luis Rodriguez. The Munnings colt then sped off for the front end quickly passing Half Full after a first quarter in 23.57 and a half mile in 45.62. Rodriguez and Late September prevailed through the stretch to post a 2-14-length win over 3-to-5 favorite Tumbarumba.

Calicoco was another four lengths back in third.

Bred by Coteau Grove Farms, Late September (\$12) broke his maiden in open company in his second start at Churchill Downs early in the 2-year-old season.

He was given the summer off before resurfacing in the Bayou state in Camejo's barn to make an October start in a state-bred stakes victory at Delta Downs.

He splashed to a third place finish opening weekend at Fair Grounds in the Joseph R. Peluso stakes in his prior race.

"His last race he moved from seven furlongs (at Delta) to 5-1/2 furlongs here which can be a little confusing for a 2-year-old like him," Camejo said. "Plus the track was wet. We've kept him happy, and with the extra half-furlong today with the outside post I think that made a big difference."

Late September navigated the six furlong race in 1:11.04.

Owner Kevin Stedman paid \$60,000 for the son of Munnings at the 2022 Fasig Tipton July Horses of Racing Age sale. Out of the Lemon Drop Kid mare Hello Maggie May, Late September now owns a record of 5-3-0-1 with \$97,870 in career earnings.

"One of the reasons I got into the game was to follow the horses around," Stedman said. "There's a lot of beautiful tracks around the world and obviously Fair Grounds is one of them. We had eyes on coming here [and plans] that this would be a meet we targeted."

FREE DROP MADDY BATTLES TO WIN AT THE WIRE

Trainer Bret Calhoun has celebrated plenty of wins on Champions Day at Fair Grounds but not many of them were as close at the wire as Free Drop Maddy's victory in the \$100,000 Lassie.

Ridden by Reylu Gutierrez, Free Drop Maddy had to hold off a fast-charging Norah G up the rail as the two favored fillies went head-to-head the last 70 yards.

Bred by Clear Creek Stud, Free Drop Maddy won by a neck in a six-furlong time of 1:11.66 giving her back-to-back stakes win versus Louisiana-bred fillies at the meet.

Tensas Candy finished third.

"I actually had my eye on the other filly coming up the rail in the stretch," Calhoun said. "You could see it was getting tight and I thought Reylu did a good job of feeling that horse coming and steering our filly

down there to meet her and she really dug in. I was impressed by that."

Free Drop Maddy is owned by Landon Jordan's Mansfield Racing. The Texas native is a former professional drag-racing driver who ponied up \$200,000 for the daughter of Free Drop Billy topping the Texas Thoroughbred Association Two-Year-Olds in Training

Sale in April. She is out of the Half Ours mare Solo Buena and bred at Clear Creek Farm.

"Landon has been great as a relatively new owner to the game," Calhoun said. "He was pretty active at the sales this past year and we have a few horses together now that we are looking forward to running."

Free Drop Maddy paid \$4.40 in the eight-horse field. She finishes her 2-year-old season with a 6-3-1-2 record for \$225,800 in earnings that includes three restricted stakes wins sprinting on the dirt.

Pedroza saved every inch of ground, sneaking up the rail in the stretch to slip by the pace-setting Winning Romance. The two fillies battled back and forth from the eighth pole home with the nose decision going to A G's Charlotte in a final time of 1:45.72 for 1-1/16-miles on the main track.

Fort Polk, winner of last year's Distaff, settled for third.

"I never thought it was going to be that slow," Pedroza said of the fractional splits of 24.97 and 49.19 for the half established by 3-to-5 favorite Winning Romance. "So, there wasn't as much pace as last time. I saw the opening at the top of the stretch and I said let's go for it and hope she is there with me. And she

showed a lot of heart."

Trainer Patricia West was impressed by her 3-year-old Mo Tom filly whose 12 starts at Louisiana ovals have earned her \$184,660 with a record of 5-1-2 and three wins at Fair Grounds.

"We're very proud of our filly," West said. "I thought she was close enough to the pace. I thought all along she just needed to be more mature, and I think she's only getting better from here."

A G's Charlotte paid \$7.80 as the second choice in the eight-horse field.

and I talked before the race and decided his best chance was breaking good and dropping back out of it and coming with one run and that's what he did."

The overflow field of 14 starts was reduced to 12 when two pace players, Schnell and Takes Two to Tango, scratched but that didn't affect the pace set up when longshot Mike J and race favorite Bertie's Galaxy duelled back and forth in 21.57 for the first quarter and 44.79 for the half-mile.

Big Chopper (\$15) raced along from the inside but steered six-wide at the three-sixteenths pole under Lanerie flying past horses to a convincing 3-³/₄-length win. Relentless Dancer made his run from midpack to finish second in front of Mike J in third.

Big Chopper is a 3-year-old son of Shackleford out of Miss Well Molded, by Unusual Heat. The victory was his fourth win in 14 starts. Three of those wins have come at Fair Grounds.

"She got a fantastic trip and with the way she's been doing that's all she needed. We're feeling good about our barn and it's great working with owners like Richard."

A 5-year-old mare by Maclean's Music out of the Afternoon Deelites mare Pint, Zydeco Music finished off 5-1/2 furlongs on the main track in 1:05.09. She improved her race record to nine wins in 26 starts with six seconds and five thirds.

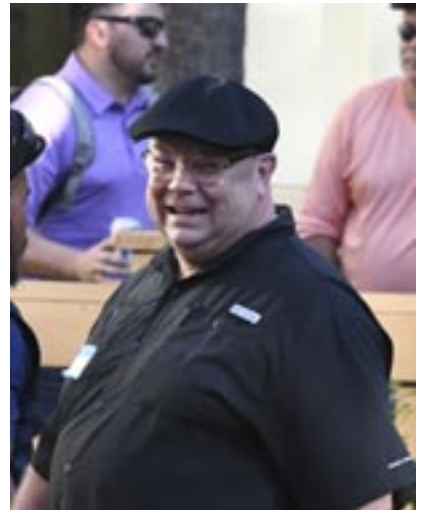

WHO TOOK THE MONEY STORMS HOME IN RESCHEDULED LOUISIANA CHAMPIONS DAY TURF

Due to problems with the Fair Grounds Turf Course, the Louisiana Champions Day Turf Stakes was re-scheduled nearly a month after the official Louisiana Bred Stakes Day. This created the unusual circumstance that allowed Who Took the Money to run in both the Louisiana Champions Day Classic on December 10, 2022, when he came in third, and the Louisiana Champions Day Turf on January 7, 2023.

Even though he had won three of his last five starts on dirt, Allied Racing Stable's Who Took the Money welcomed a return to grass,

winning the rescheduled \$100,000 Louisiana Champions Day Turf in high-stepping fashion for trainer Bret Calhoun and jockey Deshawn Parker.

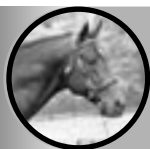
Touchuponastar, who posted an upset over the 1-2 favorite in the Champions Day Classic on dirt, was scratched from Saturday's Turf, opening the door for Who Took the Money to make amends. With the rails 34 feet out and long-shots Play Mo and Charlie G in chase mode, Maga Man dictated early terms through tough to gauge fractions of :25.09 and :52.90. Meanwhile, 2-5 favorite Who Took

the Money bided his time in sixth while in the clear. The race began to fall apart on the turn for home, and Who Took the Money displayed his patented late kick. Eventual second and third place finishers Smarty Alex and Ballinonabudget also ran on well late, but the favorite prevailed by 2 ½ lengths in 1:50.59 for 1 1/16 miles.

"He has a really big turn of foot on the turf," Parker said. "He has it on the dirt too, but on the turf it just feels totally different. I let him do his own thing. He tells me what to do. Turning for home he'll kick it in gear himself. I really don't have to do anything. I just let him do his thing and stay out of his way."

Calhoun agreed.

"I think we had overstayed our welcome on the dirt a little bit," Calhoun said. "He ran well, very consistent, but I think he had enough of it after the last time out (third in the LA Classic). I was happy to get back on the grass. It's his much preferred surface. We are going to try to keep him on the grass in the Louisiana program for as long as we can. After that, we may have go to the open horses a little bit at some point. He's kind of his own worst enemy. Like Deshawn (jockey Parker) said, he kind of does things his own way. If he gets a little bit better mentally, he might be a really good older horse."

RUSHIE

The late John Nerud was a renaissance man in the racing world as trainer, owner, and breeder, and few men knew better than he how to put together bloodlines that were not precisely the height of fashion to create a successful result. As the architect of Tartan Farms' success as well as the developer of a successful breeding operation of his own, he had a particularly marked impact on Florida breeding. Louisiana breeders now have the opportunity to benefit from his legacy via Rushie, a first-crop son of Liam's Map who will stand his second season at Blue Star Racing for \$4,000 live foal in 2023 after standing his first season in Florida in 2022.

Although Liam's Map was bred by the Albaugh Family Stable, Nerud's stamp is all over his pedigree. The buildup begins with Liam's Map's granddam Yada Yada, who couldn't get out of her own way in three starts but is inbred 2x3 to Tartan's two-time American champion sprinter Ta Wee, a daughter of 1959 American champion sprinter Intentionally (an important sire for Tartan) and a half sister to Tartan's 1968 American Horse of the Year Dr. Fager, also a two-time American champion sprinter. Adding to the interest of her pedigree, Yada Yada's sire Great Above is by Tartan-bred Minnesota Mac, whose sire Rough'n Tumble also sired Dr. Fager.

The rest of the pedigree of Liam's Map has every appearance of having been carefully constructed to bring out the potential locked away in Yada Yada's genetics. When 2000 Vosburgh Stakes (USA-G1) winner Trippi was mated to Yada Yada, he brought crosses of two key elements to the table: the brilliantly fast Mr. Prospector, and the fleet miler In Reality, the best son of Intentionally and a maternal grandson of Rough'n Tumble through that stallion's best daughter, 1959 American champion 2-year-old filly My Dear Girl. The resulting filly, 2007 Winning Colors Stakes (G3) winner Miss Macy Sue, was, thus, inbred 5x4x5 to Intentionally through his best son and daughter and also carried a 6x4 cross to Rough'n Tumble.

Miss Macy Sue's mating to Unbridled's Song packed in a second helping of Tartan/Nerud bloodlines

via Unbridled's Song's sire Unbridled—a horse whose second dam, Charedi, is a daughter of In Reality and whose third dam, Magic, is a Buckpasser half sister to Dr. Fager and Ta Wee. Further, Unbridled is by Nerud's Metropolitan Handicap (G1) winner Fappiano, a maternal grandson of Dr. Fager. Just to add one final touch to the picture, Prince Blessed, sire of Unbridled's Song's third dam, traces back in his tail-female line to Clonaslee, also the direct ancestress of In Reality.

Liam's Map could carry his speed nine furlongs but was at his best at a mile, winning the 2015 Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) as well as that year's Woodward Stakes (G1). Rushie's dam Conquest Angel was an unknown quantity as she never raced, but her breeding leans more toward two-turn stamina. Sired by 2008 Travers Stakes (G1) winner Colonel John (by two-time Breeders' Cup Classic, G1, winner Tiznow from the Turkoman mare Sweet Damsel), she is out of the Smart Strike mare More Oats Please, also the dam of 2014 Alcibiades Stakes (G1) winner Peace and War (by War Front). The speed on this side of the pedigree comes through More Oats Please's stakes-placed dam Miss Yiayia (a half sister to eight-time New York-bred

stakes winner Miss Valentine), whose sire Gilded Time was the champion two-year-old male of 1992. The next dam in Rushie's tail-female line, Miss Baja (by Mr. Leader), won the 1979 Apple Blossom Handicap (G2) and is the dam of 1989 Fleur de Lis Handicap (G3) winner Stoneleigh's Hope (by Damascus).

The closest inbreeding in Rushie's pedigree is 5x4 to Mr. Prospector, but Conquest Angel brought in two other ties back to the bloodlines found in Liam's Map. Colonel John is a male-line descendant of In Reality, and he carries another cross back to In Reality's female family through his fourth dam Sticks N' Stones, whose sire Gee Whiz is a half brother to the dam of Prince Blessed.

Rushie won at second asking at Santa Anita in January of his 3-year-old season. Three more races (which included an allowance win) later, he made his stakes debut in the Santa Anita Derby (G1) and ran on willingly through the stretch to finish third, beaten 3½ lengths by Honor A. P. and just 1¼ lengths by eventual Horse of the Year Authentic. Seeking a Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) berth, Rushie ran into another tough field in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) and was third to eventual Grade 1 winner Art Collector and future Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Swiss Skydiver, the champion 3-year-old filly of 2020.

The colt cut back in distance for the Pat Day Mile Stakes Presented by LG&E and KU (G2) on the Derby undercard, and this proved a winning move. Though wide throughout, Rushie came home first in a smart 1:34.41, leaving H. Allen Jerkens Stakes (G1) winner Echo Town and future Grade 3 winner Tap It to Win in



his wake. That was his last win, but he added two stakes placings at 4 before retiring with \$697,941 in earnings.

A handsome gray with a well laid shoulder, powerful hindquarters, and short cannons, Rushie looks the part of a top miler and should match well with the speedy Louisiana mare base, yet has the stamina elements in his pedigree to be able to blend successfully with mares inclined more toward two turns. Mares returning elements of the Nerud/Tartan breeding program such as Quiet American, Cozzene, Great Above, Pentelicus, Honour and Glory, and Ogygian should be worth considering. In addition, he should be a good choice for mares tracing to Storm Cat and for mares inbred to Northern Dancer, and mares that have previously produced good performers by Half Ours and their daughters should also be considered for him.

Family First for Owner and Breeder Thomas Galvin

Growing up in Omaha, Nebraska, horseracing fans at the local racetrack Aksarben, were able to see legendary trainer Jack Van Berg as well as visiting jockeys, including Hall of Famers Mike Smith and Pat Day. The renowned oval, (Nebraska spelled backwards), closed in 1995, but memories remain for a legion of fans.

That was the case for respected Thoroughbred owner and breeder Thomas Galvin.

“I grew up in Omaha,” said Galvin. “My dad was a barber and loved to play the daily double. When I was 15, I’d sneak into the track. Can’t say that I remembered any of the legends; I just enjoyed watching the horses run. But I do remember saying to myself that when I have the money, I want to buy a racehorse.”

A successful career in accounting and private equity ensued and in 2002, Galvin began “dabbling” in racing. He was introduced to Eddie Milligan and Bret Calhoun and attended his first yearling sale.

Seducing Mr G was his first purchase and the lessons on buying and selling came quickly.

“Tom was always receptive to any and all information,” recalled Calhoun. “He’s a smart guy who makes his own decisions.”

Calhoun played a pivotal role in Galvin’s top earner, Su Casa G Casa at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Texas Yearling Sale. He was sired by During, a \$350,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale graduate who



earned over \$800,000. Bret bid \$9,000 and asked Galvin if he wanted to own him.



Norah G wins the filly division of the Louisiana Futurity for 2YO Louisiana-Breds.

The Louisiana-bred gelding broke his maiden on September 4, 2010 at Louisiana Downs and went on to capture six stakes and complete his career in 2013 with earnings of \$473,473.

From the beginning, each horse he owned had the initial “G” in their name and that has continued for 17 years. Galvin, who resides in Dallas, is the proud father of Adrienne and Josh as well as five grandchildren: Evan, Lucas, Charlotte, Olivia and Norah. Each have horses bearing their names.

Galvin also has a successful partnership with John K. Caulfield; the “G” is a mainstay in each of their runners, but Caulfield is a creative force in several of the names.

“We’ll sit down and have a beer and talk names,” explained Galvin. “We bought a big, gray colt by Ironicus for \$1,000 at the Keeneland Sale and named him One G.”

Others who have not lived up to their earnings include Down 80 G and Down 95 G. As you can surmise, neither proved to be the most successful purchases for the partners!

Galvin posted his most successful year as an owner in 2022 and capped off the year with two stakes victories at Fair Grounds.

His homebred Norah G was a convincing winner in the \$100,000 Louisiana Futurity for trainer Patricia West and jockey DeShawn Parker, who guided the gray filly to victory. Sired by Fast Anna out of the Malibu Moon mare Mr. G’s Moonshine, Norah G has earned \$110,000 in just three starts. She was named for Galvin’s granddaughter Norah.

A G’s Charlotte, named for another granddaughter, came off the pace to capture the \$75,000 Big World Stakes for older Louisiana-bred females. She was making her 11th start for West and rider Pedroza Jr.

She followed up with a hard fought win in the \$100,000 Louisiana Champions Day Ladies Distaff, edging favorite Winning Romance at the wire.

Galvin does not own a farm,

admitting that he leaves the day-to-day care of his racehorses and four broodmares with a well-coordinated team. His trusted advisors include Gillian Taylor at Channon Farm, who raises the foals before they are sent to veteran horseman Eddie Milligan at Twin Oaks Training Center.

"Eddie is not an easy read," admitted Galvin. "As they begin training, I'll ask him which horses have the potential. He won't give me any indication how good they are!"

Of course, veterinary care is extremely important and Galvin has been very pleased with Dr. David Stephens at Weems and Stephens

Patricia West trains for Galvin. She was recommended by Keith Desormeaux, who was leaving

Louisiana and encouraged Galvin to meet with the Kentucky-born horseman.

"We got along very well from the beginning," acknowledged West. "Some owners leave all the decisions to their trainers, but Tom is very proactive. He pours over condition books and looks for spots for his horses; I like his input."

West looks forward to the next starts for A G's Charlotte, her first stakes winner and Norah G, saying that both came out of their most recent victories in good shape.

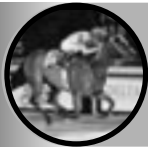
"Charlotte, who used to be the princess, is now the queen," said West. "Norah G is our tomboy filly; neither are quirky!"

There is plenty to look forward to for Galvin in 2023 as both of the stakes winners will run and Adrienne G was bred to Alternation and will deliver a foal this year.

The challenges of owning and breeding Thoroughbreds keep Galvin on his toes. He enjoys sharing his passion with his grandchildren and acknowledges the hard work of each member of his team.

"It takes a team," stated Galvin. "Thankfully, I have a really good one!"

NUTRITION FOR PREGNANT MARES

Over the past 3 decades we've learned more about fine-tuning nutrition for pregnant mares. Dr. Kathleen Crandell, Equine Nutritionist, Kentucky Equine Research, says the nutrient requirements for each broodmare can be different, depending on whether they are still lactating when bred, or just barren or maiden mares.

"Mares gaining weight have better conception rates, and mares losing weight have poorer conception rates. With a lactating mare, there's a chance she will be losing weight; she puts so much nutrition into producing milk. This may have an effect on her ability to conceive or maintain a pregnancy," she says.

"By contrast, with the barren mare or maiden mare there's usually not much thought regarding nutrition, especially in early pregnancy, but having the right balance of nutrients in the diet is equally important for them, for everything to work correctly in fetal development. We don't want those mares deficient or losing weight, and we also don't want them too fat. We want them in a body condition score between 5 and 6. If they are easy keepers on pasture or pasture and hay they may just need a vitamin-mineral supplement of some sort," says Crandell.

"Often those needs can be met with a mineralized salt when mares are out on pasture, but you can't control intake that way—

particularly in a group of mares. If they can be fed individually, using a ration-balancer pellet, this is a good way to supply them with the vitamins and minerals as well as supplemental protein, since they don't need the extra calories of a typical concentrate," she explains.

"If a mare is a hard-keeper, needing more calories, a concentrate can be fed. At this early stage of pregnancy it doesn't need to be one that's formulated specifically for broodmares but you do need to pay attention to feeding rate. If a mare is getting less than the minimum recommended feeding rate she won't be getting the proper amount of vitamins and minerals and you'd need to top it off with a ration balancer supplement," she says.

"Omega-3 fatty acid supplementation in the forms of EPA and DHA may help broodmares at breeding time. In one study, mares supplemented with a marine-derived Omega-3 supplement had better uterine health than their un-supplemented cohorts. Another study found higher levels of progesterone, faster involution of the nonpregnant horn after foaling, and reduced post-breeding inflammatory response," says Crandell.

During pregnancy, the mare's nutrient requirements gradually increase. "In the first trimester we just make sure mares maintain proper body weight, without having them gain too much weight. They don't need a lot of extra feed

at first, but they do need proper nutrient balance. It was customary in years past for breeders to turn mares out to pasture after they were bred and not look at them again until the last trimester. This is no longer considered ideal. Even though these mares might get enough protein and calories from the pasture, they might be missing some of the other essential nutrients, particularly some of the trace minerals," she says.

"During the first and second trimester they may need supplementation to supply the missing nutrients. This can be done by feeding a concentrate designed for pregnant mares, or just a ration-balancer if you are trying to keep a mare from gaining too much weight," she says.

It gets more complicated during the last trimester since the growth of the foal is exponential, increasing most rapidly in later stages of pregnancy. "There is hardly any weight gain from the foal in early pregnancy; it's mostly an increase in placental tissues until about the 7th month of gestation—and then the fetus grows swiftly. Some nutrients like calcium and phosphorus are important for fetal bone development, along with zinc, copper, manganese, selenium etc. which need to be supplemented in adequate amounts. If the mare doesn't have enough in her diet, she will rob these essential nutrients from her own body, to supply the needs of the fetus. The last

thing you want is for her to become deficient at this time, shortly before lactation.”

In the last trimester the fetus accumulates stores of trace minerals in its liver. “This gives the foal an adequate supply for a while after it is born, since these minerals are not transferred very well in the milk. Thus it is important for the pregnant mare to have adequate supply of these minerals in her diet so she won’t deplete her own body while the fetus is developing and storing minerals in its liver,” says Crandell.

In late gestation some mares experience weight loss and often this can be addressed by increasing the amount of concentrate. “A study looking at maintaining late gestational mares on a forage-only diet of either timothy or alfalfa hay found the mares were unable to maintain their weight on timothy hay alone. Timothy hay was not energy-dense enough to support fetal growth/weight gain and maintenance needs of the mare.”

Providing a more calorie-dense forage such as alfalfa helps. “In the last month of gestation a mare may not be able to eat more volume of hay because the bulk of the fetus/placenta in the abdomen takes up more space and restricts capacity of the digestive tract. The mare can’t take in as much feed, so to keep her from losing weight a more calorie-dense feed may be needed. Providing additional fat (such as vegetable oil) can significantly boost calories without adding bulk. However, don’t forget the importance of forage in the diet. You can increase calories by providing a more energy-dense forage like alfalfa or a high-quality alfalfa-grass mix instead of a bulkier,

lower-calorie hay like timothy,” she says.

“If the mare has been maintaining well on grass hay during early pregnancy and mid-pregnancy you can add some alfalfa during the last trimester, to boost calories and nutrients without having to feed so much concentrate,” says Crandell. If you have a mare that typically loses a lot of weight when lactating, you could feed her up to a little heavier weight before she foals, to be ahead of the curve.

“As calories in the diet increase, there is always a concern about whether it will have an effect on the mare’s ability to handle increases in insulin without detriment to the mare or her foal. All mares become a little bit insulin-resistant during pregnancy as a natural way to boost glucose delivery to the fetus, so a study in Thoroughbreds looked at development of insulin resistance during pregnancy—to measure how much influence it had on insulin resistance in the foal. In this study there was no detriment on insulin handling in newborn foals, but if there is a genetic factor that makes an individual horse more prone to insulin resistance (outside of pregnancy), that foal may have problems as it matures,” she says.

There are issues that can arise with mares that have insulin resistance problems. “Some of these mares fail to enter seasonal anestrus or may have prolonged periods between heat cycles, and a decline in age-related fertility. It is important to maintain mares with questionable insulin-handling issues at an appropriate body weight and not let them become obese. A study looking at the effects of obesity in mares on insulin-handling in their foals found that while these mares

had heavier foals than non-obese mares, there was no correlation with hyperinsulinemia in the foals. The foals were found to have more difficulty nursing because of the fat deposits around the teats, and the mares had decreased milk production,” says Crandell.

In another study, IgG concentrations in colostrum were lower in obese mares. Obesity in the mare can affect the fetus by predisposing the foal to developmental orthopedic disease after birth. “Heavier foals require vigilant monitoring because of the adverse effects on weight-bearing bone development.”

Protein is always needed to build body tissues. “The mare needs adequate protein in her diet to supply building blocks for fetal growth and development of the placenta and amniotic tissues; otherwise she will break down her own muscle tissue to provide protein for that foal. To a certain extent, the foal will always have enough, even if the mare robs from her own body. This is why mildly protein-deficient mares don’t give birth to smaller foals, but those mares are at a big disadvantage for lactation and recovery from the pregnancy (before they can be rebred). There is no need for excessive protein, but we have to make sure the mare has adequate protein,” explains Crandell. Any excess protein will simply be broken down and excreted in urine.

“Horses on pasture usually have adequate protein, especially if you add a balancer or a concentrate. If the mare is on a hay diet, more attention needs to be paid to protein content of the hay. Some grass hays are fairly low in protein, so you could add alfalfa hay and/or a con-

centrate and ration balancer to boost the protein," she says.

The lactating mare needs double the amount of protein than the early gestational mare, to produce milk. "If dietary protein is restricted, it will result in a decrease in milk production, and consequential decrease in foal growth," says Crandell.

There have also been studies to see whether quality of diet could influence quality of colostrum. "Those studies looked at nutrients like vitamin E, omega 3 fatty acids and bioactive proteins (in serum). There was some indication that if a mare is receiving a diet high in omega 3 fatty acids (in the form of DHA) it will improve the IgG concentration in the colostrum," she says.

"Bioactive protein supplementa-

tion also resulted in higher IgG levels in the mares. Late gestation mares need adequate nutrients and proper amount of protein in order to create high quality colostrum that contains adequate antibodies."

Some of the individual nutrients also seem very important for the growing fetus. "Research at Cornell University showed that mares receiving inadequate selenium in diet were much more prone to reproductive problems than mares with adequate selenium. Another study, comparing higher versus lower levels of selenium supplementation in late gestation and lactating mares found higher serum IgG in the foals from mares with higher level of supplementation up through 8 weeks of age," says Crandell.

A study looking at copper sup-

plementation in New Zealand where forages are notorious for being low in copper found that mares supplemented with copper had foals with lower incidence of physitis and osteochondritis dissecans (OCD) at 6 months of age than mares not receiving supplemental copper, regardless of whether the foals received supplemental copper themselves or not.

In another study, serum copper levels in supplemented mares were positively correlated with copper in the colostrum and serum copper levels in the foals.

"To me, this indicates how important it is to feed the mare properly during pregnancy. You can influence health of the foal, beyond birth, by making sure the mare has proper nutrients in her diet," says Crandell.

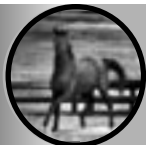

Wagering Down Slightly In 2022 While Purses Reach Record Highs

Equibase, North American racing's official database, has released

its year-end 2022 statistics for the industry's economic indicators, including field size, wagering, and other data, along with 2019 and 2020 comparables. The 2019 data is included as a pre-COVID-19 comparison.

The final numbers from 2022 show a 0.87 percent dip in total wagering: \$12,108,807,335 this year, versus \$12,215,598,838 in 2021.

This is the second year since 2009 that wagering has topped \$12 billion. By comparison, the 2009 wagering total of \$12.3 billion came from a total of 49,368 races;

the 2022 wagering totals were from 33,453 races.

Wagering in December was down 7.5 percent year-over-year, a downward trend that extended to the entire fourth quarter of the year: total betting was down 5.5 percent in the last three months of the year, when compared to the same quarter in 2021.

Purses paid out in 2022 were very strong, up 10.92 percent from

2021 at a record total of \$1,309,837,841.

Average field size did continue to decline, from 7.37 in 2021 to 7.30 in 2022. According to The Jockey Club statistics, that's the lowest figure on record (records go back to 1950).

“Thoroughbred racing purses and pari-mutuel handle continued to exhibit strength in 2022. Purses were up double-digits year-over

year and reached an all-time high thanks in part to contributions from other gaming sources,” said NTRA President and CEO Tom Rooney. “Pari-mutuel handle was nearly equal to 2021 and the second highest since 2009. These business trends occurred during a year of unprecedented growth in legal, state regulated sports betting. The 2023 gaming landscape promises to be more competitive than ever for the sports wagering dollar. It also represents a huge opportunity to introduce pari-mutuel wagering and the sport of Thoroughbred racing to a vast new audience if we as an industry embrace the challenge.”

Equibase is continuing to provide monthly reporting of its Economic Indicators Advisories as a service to the industry and in consideration of the economic changes resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Advisory is typically disseminated on a quarterly basis to provide key metrics used to measure racing's performance throughout the year.

“Our graduates are proof of the quality our consignors have offered each year,” Bridewell said. “We’re excited to get to work on putting together another solid edition in April.”

The breeze show is set for Monday, April 3rd, on the Lone Star Park dirt. The sale will be held Wednesday, April 5, 2023, inside the sales pavilion.

FDA Cautions Horse Owners Not to Feed Recalled Lots of Top of the Rockies Alfalfa Cubes due to Reports of Illness and Death

On December 17, 2022, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration issued a warning about recalled lots of alfalfa cubes that appear to have caused illness and death in horses; at this time, the FDA reports that horses in Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado have shown neurological signs that may be related to this issue. The LSU School of Veterinary Medicine is working with the FDA and the Louisiana Department of

Agriculture & Forestry (LDAF) to investigate this issue and treat some of the affected horses.

At this time, the Louisiana Animal Disease Diagnostic Lab (LADDL) at LSU Vet Med has conducted necropsies on 12 horses. Testing of some of the alfalfa cubes and tissues from those horses is being conducted by the diagnostic lab at the University of California, Davis School of Veterinary Medicine.

LSU Vet Med cannot comment on its patients due to patient privacy laws, but Rose Baker, BVMS, DACVIM, assistant professor of equine medicine, is treating some horses with neurological signs believed to be related to this issue. If information becomes available that affects horse health, LSU Vet Med will work with the FDA and LDAF on advisories for the public. Dr. Baker is working with both of these agencies to investigate the cause and protect horses.

of the collective efforts of its members who are responsible for ensuring compliance with government laws and regulations designed to protect the general public and racing industry participants, including the equine and canine athletes.

Landry will deliver the conference's keynote address on Tuesday March 7. As Louisiana's attorney general, he has been at the forefront of states challenging the constitutionality of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) and the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (Authority) that the law established. In addition to constitutionality issues, Landry has expressed concern for the financial

hardship that a largely duplicative bureaucracy will put on large portions of the horse-racing industry. Louisiana has four tracks that conduct horse racing.

"Louisiana Attorney General Jeff Landry embodies the positive vision with the inspiration and passion we seek in a keynote speaker," said Eric Hamelback, the National HBPA's CEO. "He has proven to be a strong advocate for horsemen and women who understands our labor-intensive industry with its substantial agribusiness, not only in Louisiana but throughout the country. He believes in a bright and better future for horse racing, and refuses to let us be trampled by spe-

cial interests."

"I am honored to be chosen the keynote speaker at the National HBPA Conference, and I look forward to visiting with so many who ply their trade in such a great industry," said Landry, a decorated Army veteran. "I will continue fighting for them to prevent the federal government from taking over horse racing."

The HBPA and ARCI will share panel discussions and presentations during their overlapping conferences while staging their business sessions separately. HISA will be the focus.

"Within horse racing right now, the obvious overarching topic is the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act," said National HBPA President Dr. Doug Daniels, an equine veterinarian and racehorse owner/breeder. "Even as the challenges of its unlawfulness proceed and many in the industry fight back against the lack of transparency and overwhelming cost, we must understand portions of HISA are the law of the land everywhere but in the Fifth Circuit. Our goal in joining with Association of Racing Commissioners International at our conference is to provide a forum for frank discussions on where we are, where we're headed, how we navigate an admittedly flawed law and process, and how everything should look after the court decisions are settled."

One key panel could be called "what's next?," addressing alternative legislation to HISA and other options for a path forward for the industry. Panelists will include ARCI President Ed Martin and Amy Cook, the executive director of the Texas Racing Commission.

"A major part of the conference

will be focused on laying out the issues with HISA and also how the industry can move forward,” Hamelback said. “We strongly believe there are more effective means that are constitutional. We also believe bringing the leadership of all stakeholders to the table will provide positive change that improves our industry without

jeopardizing the financial health of smaller racetracks and racing stables.”

The meeting of the ARCI’s model rules committee will be open for both groups to attend. The ARCI model rules — developed with input from industry stakeholders while seeking scientific guidance and identifying best prac-

tices — are the blue print many racing commissions use for their state regulations.

Other joint sessions include a HISA litigation update, equine welfare with a focus on aftercare and scientific developments, fixed odds in horse racing and a trainers’ panel featuring Louisiana HBPA board members Bret Calhoun and Ron

Faucheux and Kentucky HBPA board member Jason Barkley.

2023 TAA Accreditation Application Now Available

Thoroughbred aftercare nonprofits interested in applying must complete the application by the closing date of April 1 at 6 p.m. ET. Since TAA accreditation is only granted for a specific period of time, organizations with accreditation status ending in 2022 that want to remain accredited need to re-apply.

"Going into our 11th year of accreditation, the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance looks forward to working with new applicants and returning organizations to reach the highest standard of aftercare," said TAA Accreditation and Grants Manager, Janice Towles.

Accreditation status is determined after a complete review of five areas of an aftercare organization: operations, education, horse health care management, facility standards and services, and adoption policies and protocols. Organizations passing the application review will be subject to site inspections of all facilities housing Thoroughbreds.

Organizations that receive accreditation are eligible to receive financial grants from the TAA, but prior grants awarded are no indication of potential future awards. In 2022 the TAA awarded \$3.6 million to accredited organizations as grants earmarked specifically for equine care, totaling more than \$28.1 million awarded since 2012.

Any organization interested in applying for TAA accreditation must fulfill the following five min-

imum requirements:

1. Organization must have a current status as a 501(c)(3) federal not-for-profit (U.S.) or must be a registered charity within the meaning of the Income Tax Act (Canada).

2. Organization must have been in operation for at least three years. The TAA will confirm operation information, including with the secretary of state or provincial business registry.

3. At time of application, organization must either (1) currently exclusively own and provide care for a minimum of 5 registered Thoroughbreds, or (2) currently exclusively own and provide care for at least 3-4 registered Thoroughbreds AND must have exclusively owned and provided care for at least 10 registered Thoroughbreds over the previous 12 months. Registered Thoroughbreds leased by the organization or owned by third parties at the same facility should not be included.

4. Organization must have a written euthanasia policy consistent with the American Association of Equine Practitioners.

5. Organization, or a principal of the organization or individual directly related to the organization, shall not have any current legal proceedings pending against them which adversely impact the aftercare operations, the organization's standards of care, or the 501(c)(3) status of the organization.

Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Associations' President, Warren Harang, called the meeting to order and asked Therese Arroyo to call the roll. Ten (10) Directors were present. With a quorum of Directors present, Warren declared the meeting was ready to proceed with business.

Jake Delhomme led everyone present in prayer.

Conflict Updates: Warren requested the Directors provide any updates to their individual conflict policies. There were no updates from the Directors for the record.

Minutes of 7/11/2022: A correction was cited for the minutes of the June 11, 2022, board meeting. Michele Rodriguez was absent from this meeting, and the minutes should be amended to reflect this. Warren asked if there were any further corrections to be made, and there were none. Warren requested approval of the minutes to the meeting of the Board on June 11, 2022. John Duvieilh and Alex Bonin reviewed the proposed By-Laws, explaining that the only differences between the By-Laws under review today and the By-Laws reviewed by the Board at the meeting on July 19, 2022, are the changes noted as necessary at the July 19, 2022, Board of Directors meeting. The By-Laws were reviewed in open meeting, one at a time. All changes noted from the meeting were reviewed in detail. After discussion was had and

Warren Harang called the meeting to order and asked Roger Heitzmann to call the roll. A quorum was present with Brett

Brinkman and Danny Guidry absent. The meeting was ready to proceed with business.

Jake Delhomme led us in prayer.

Warren opened the floor to discuss the presented By-Laws which passed the Membership Committee and the By-Laws Committee unanimously.

With Attorney Alex Bonin being absent due to sickness, Attorney John Duvieilh took the floor.

Discussion immediately began regarding clarification of the By-Laws, specifically By-Law #1 regarding the ability to vote as a member. Michelle clarified that just being a member is not enough to vote and members must still qualify according to the By-Law to be eligible as a voting member. She added that better clarification of this by-law on paper would avoid any possible further confusion for members. Warren stated that it is still one member equals one vote. Charlotte added to the discussion how someone, or an organization, would/could be eligible for a vote if they split accreditation among several people. More discussion continued over what percentage standard a member must own to be eligible and be considered as a voting member. Michelle and Charlotte want to keep the percentage at 50% or higher for members and organizations alike. Keith countered that keeping a high percentage, or going even higher, could exclude smaller groups of voters or possible voters who share a horse, but not enough to be considered to vote. Michelle states that anyone could be a member, but to vote the criteria must be met for members, which right now is a 50% share or more. Michelle and Charlotte continued to discuss the wording of the By-Law and how it needed to be updated/edited at this meeting so it can be fixed and made public to the members as soon as possible. Keith Hernandez called to keep By-Law #1 the same but adjust the wording to be more concise and clearer. Warren asked for a show of hands regarding the matter. Tom Early was the only member who opposed By-Law #1. With every other member voting in favor, Tom asked that we move forward, and Warren declared the matter settled and moved on.

After extensive discussion of By-Law 1, the remainder of the By-Laws were addressed in order and board members were asked to state if they had any issues or edits with any of the written By-Laws. Tom pointed out that By-laws #2, #9, #17, and #20 have a position listed as "Executive Director", but there is no such position title. This needs to be updated to the correct job title, "Secretary Treasurer". Warren declared for this to be done and to move on. Next, the Board discussed By-Law #15; it states a 20-day notice for special meetings would be required. Charlotte asked why the notice was moved from 10 days to 20 days and Tom agreed this seemed like an excessive amount of time. Warren stated if no one was concerned about needing the 20 days it could be moved back down to 10 since the meeting dates are decided a few weeks out in advance anyway. Tom made a motion to move the notice back down to 10 days which was seconded by Jake Delhomme and passed unanimously. By-Law #23 states that the Secretary /Treasurer serve as the Executive Director of the Association. John stated that this was not changed and that we will change back the areas where we changed that earlier. Warren asked the board if there were any other additions, questions, or edits for the By-Laws. It was suggested that By-Law #5, which states that all dues must be paid by July 1st, should also state "or

within 30 days of eligibility of being a new member". This way if someone buys a horse in November but wants to be a member immediately, they do not have to wait. Warren agreed this was a great addition. It was also remarked that By-Law #28's language should also be added onto to state "Brood mare must return to Louisiana within 90 days of foaling" and/or "Brood mare must be returned to Louisiana by August 1st". It was remarked that the 90 days is in place to give people enough time to move the horse back to Louisiana. Tom Early stated this should be added onto section A and B of this By-Law. Warren agreed that having a set date, August 1st, that the horses need to be back in Louisiana would make much of the process easier for all involved but that exceptions could be made in extreme instances where the horse cannot be transported, such as injury or illness. Tom made a motion to change the By-Law to state "by August 1st", but with non-resident mares it stays the same at 90 days. This motion was seconded by Jay, which was voted on and passed unanimously. Warren asked if anyone had any other edits for the By-Laws. With no further corrections, questions, edits, or suggestions for the By-Laws, Warren declared to proceed with the agenda.

A quick discussion ensued over HISA, the current updated information, and what HISA means for us and our members going forward. Warren asked if anyone has any questions regarding this. No one did, so he declared to move forward with the agenda.

The next item on the agenda was to discuss the upcoming yearling sale followed by a mixed session for the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association's Breeders Sale. Tom Early mentioned the Quarter Horse Association has approached him and asked him if it was possible to enter quarter horse yearlings into our sale. It was thought this was a good idea as more entries in sales are always a good thing and the board discussed the number of stalls available. Warren agreed and asked for a show of hands for opposition. No board members opposed this idea, so Warren declared the motion as carried. Tom also reminded the board that Ads can be placed inside sale catalogues and that if any board member wanted to advertise to contact the office. Warren declared for Tom to take care of the matter and the meeting went on with business.

Tom Early made a motion to go into executive session. The motion was seconded by Michele LaVoice, voted on and passed unanimously.

Charlotte made a motion to exit Executive Session. Tom seconded this motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.
