BREEDING SHED

Keeping the Membership informed, LTBA President Warren J. Harang, III

The 2019 breeding season is approaching fast and several new stallions will be calling Louisiana home. Grade 1 stakes winner Gemologist, a national leading 3rd crop sire is moving from WinStar Farm in Versailles, KY to Acadiana Equine at Copper Crowne in Opelousas. Grade 1 stakes winner Daaher is moving from Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky to Don Hargroder's Circle H Farms in Abbeville. With 8 crops of racing age, the son of Awesome Again brings a stud record which includes 8 blacktype winners including G2SW . Moving from Crestwood in Lexington, is Country Day, a Grade 2 stakes winning son of Speightstown whose third crop are 2yo's of 2018 and whose winners include G3SW Will Call. Country Day will be standing at Lora Pitre's Peach Lane Farms in Opelousas. Another Graded Stakes Winner, Clearly Now is standing at Clear Creek Stud in Folsom. Clearly Now is a multiple graded stakes winning son of Horse Greeley who entered stud privately earlier this year. G1SW Gemologist, a national leading 3rd crop sire is moving from WinStar Farm in Versailles, KY to Acadiana Equine at Copper Crowne in Opelousas. Additionally, we have two time Thanksgiving Handicap winner Yockey's Warrior (Warrior's Reward) retiring from the track to stand at Holly Hill Farm in Benton. I encourage everyone to research these new (to Louisiana) studs as well as the familiar ones in the upcoming Louisiana Horse

Stallion Register which will be out just before Louisiana Champions Day.

There are already many outstanding early bird nominations to Louisiana Champions Day, which will run Saturday, December 8 at New Orleans Fair Grounds. Final nomination deadline is fast approaching. Be sure to get your entries in by November 15. I hope to see a great crowd for this event which always highlights the best of Louisiana bred racing.

I am happy to report that the Equine Sales Company continues to show improving numbers. Both the Consignor Select Yearling Sale in September and the Open Yearling and Mixed Sale at the end of October, recorded increases in both gross sales and average prices. At the Consignor Select Yearling Sale, 150 of 206 yearlings sold this year for a total of \$1,949,900 with an average of \$12,999 and median of \$6,000. A total of 138 of 193 head sold last year. The figures marked an 19.2% increase in gross sales from last year's \$1,636,400 and a 9.6% jump in average from \$11,858. The 2018 Open Yearling and Mixed sessions combined for sales of \$333,100 with 85 of 126 head sold for an average price of \$3,919. Last year's auction reported gross sales of \$203,350 with 84 of 183 sold with an average of \$2,421. You can find complete sales results starting on page 35 of this issue.

This fall and winter Harrah's Louisiana Downs is opening its backside for boarding and training. With the recent closing of the

Evangeline Training Center, this is a welcome option for our horsemen. The Bossier City track will be open for training from November 15-March 19.

Louisiana bred thoroughbreds are making strides now in another national showcase. A retired Louisiana bred racehorse took first place in the show jumping division of the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover. The LTBA fully encourages participation in this program to give purpose to our thoroughbreds once their racing careers are over. To that point, the LTBA sponsored a \$2,500 prize for the top placing Louisiana-bred in the competition. Congratulations to all of the connections of Interactif Spy, a 2013 gelding (Interactif—Runaway Spy, Mt. Livermore), bred in Louisiana by D&F Horse Farms LLC, and ridden by Morgan Boyer, a professional from Stokesdale, North Carolina. You can read more about the pair starting on page 22 of this issue.

I encourage everyone to be actively involved in all aspects of our industry. Come to a board meeting; be informed and involved. Come to the races; bring your family and friends; the more interest we can generate, the better for all of us. "The more the merrier!" We at the LTBA are doing all we can to be of service to you, the breeders. If you have any questions about our program, the staff in our offices at Fair Grounds and Louisiana Downs are happy to help. Stallion Awards are paid based on a stallion's progeny finishing first, second or third in an allowance, handicap or stakes race in Louisiana or in a stakes race outside of Louisiana.



LOUISIANA TOBA BREEDER OF THE YEAR

Bertram and Richard Klein

With three Louisiana-bred stakes winners in 2017, the late Bertram Klein and his son, Richard, have been named Louisiana's recipient of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders award.

The Klein family of Louisville, Kentucky, is a longstanding mainstay in Thoroughbred racing. While most of their success has centered around Kentucky-breds racing at their home track of Churchill Downs, an introduction to the breeding program in Louisiana has proved to be a valuable outlet for several of their horses.

Elaine Klein, the matriarch of the family, passed away in 2013. Elaine's husband, Bertram, died in March 2017. Richard carries the torch.

The Kleins' main breeding operation is at Fred Mitchell's Clarkland Farm near Lexington Kentucky. A few years ago, they were looking for a place to retire a runner to stud outside of Kentucky.

Trainer Merrill Scherer introduced Richard to Lora Pitre at Peach Lane Farms in Opelousas, Louisiana.

"We were looking for a home for Due Date (El Prado-Hidden Assets, by Mt. Livermore)," Klein said.

Richard Klein, who with his late father Bertram Klein, was selected Louisiana TOBA Breeder of the year.

"We sent a couple of mares there thinking we'd see what would happen. We just hit."

Trainer Brad Cox trains the Klein runners, and in 2017 won a pair of stakes with 2013 Lagfuhr daughter, Believe in Bertie who won the 2017 Daisy Devine Stakes and Red Camelia Stakes both at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots. She went on to run second in the \$300,000 G2 Churchill Distaff Turf Mile Stakes and the G3 Old

Forester Mint Julep Handicap, both at Churchill Downs. Additionally, in 2017 the filly set a new course record at Fair Grounds going about 1 1/16 miles on the turf in 1:40.31.

Gladyouaswme, by Due Date, won the 2017 Louisiana Legacy Stakes at Delta Downs. The now three year old colt added the LA Bred Premier Night Prince Stakes this February and has now won four of six starts with over \$200,000 in earnings.

Extra Credit, a 2013 gelding by Proud Citizen out of Storm Cat line mare Sunny Isles, won the 2017 Louisiana Champions Day Turf Stakes at Fair Grounds last December. He is twice stakes placed thus far in 2018.

"Lora has done a great job raising the babies; she brings them up to Kentucky to be put into training with Charlie and Amy LoPresti and they are happy with the way they look," Klein said. "It's been a good partnership. I love the Louisiana-bred program.

"It's worked out well. There's nothing like winning a race and if you can get an additional breeders' award, it makes it even Better."

ASTROLOGY

September can be a hot month anywhere in the South, but Astrology gave a new meaning to Louisiana heat when he came up with two new juvenile stakes winners in six days. After Amy Farah Fowler dashed home first in the Mrs. Henry D. Paxon Stakes at Presque Isle Downs on September 16, Battleground Star captured the Rachel's Turn Stakes at Charles Town on September 22. Currently the leader of the Louisiana third-crop sire list and second on the state's general sire list in his first season in Louisiana, the young stallion is proving a popular addition to Acadiana Equine@Copper Crowne, where he stood the 2018 season for \$4,000.

September's successes highlight one of Astrology's strengths, which is the ability to get runners capable of scoring early in their careers. All four of his stakes winners to date, including 2016 Matron Stakes (G3) winner Arella Rockstar, earned their black type at 2, and so far, 42% of his foals of racing age—including 2-year-olds of 2018—have started as juveniles, with 32 coming up winners during their first season at venues all over the eastern half of the United States. They are training on creditably as well, with the stallion being represented by four multiple winners so far this year among his 3- and 4-year olds.

Astrology is getting particularly good results from mares from the Storm Cat male line (which include the dams of Amy Farah Fowler, Battleground Star, and stakes-placed Aspect) and from the Unbridled's Song male line (which includes the dam of Arella Rockstar). Neither should be surprising given Astrology's pedigree and race record.

Bred on the same sire/broodmare sire cross as champion and important sire Bernardini, Astrology is a son of 1992 American Horse of the Year and two-time American champion sire A.P. Indy out of the Quiet American mare Quiet Eclipse, making him a half brother to juvenile grade 3 winner and former Louisiana sire Lunarpal (by Successful Appeal). He is also a half brother to juvenile stakes winners Lunarlady (by Yes It's True) and Lunargal (by Yes It's

True; dam of grade 3-placed Random Walk).

Given his dam's propensity for throwing precocious stock, Astrology had every right to be good early. He was, winning the Iroquois Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs and defeating future grade 1 winners To Honor and Serve and Data Link in a seven-furlong maiden special weight at Saratoga. In addition, he was second in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) and third in the listed Garden State Stakes.

Astrology was never quite able to live up to his full promise at 3, but he placed in three more graded stakes that year including a third behind Shackelford and eventual champion 3-year-old male Animal Kingdom in the Preakness Stakes (G1). He was a winner again at four and ended his racing career having won or placed in nine of his 12 starts for earnings of \$516,977.

A.P. Indy showed a marked affinity for the Mr. Prospector line in his mates, with all but one of his important North American sire sons—Pulpit, Malibu Moon, Mineshaft, Congrats, Flatter, and Bernardini—being out of daughters of the great Claiborne sire. Bernardini, the exception, is out of a mare by Mr. Prospector's grandson Quiet American, and Pulpit, in turn, sired three-time American champion sire Tapit

from a daughter of Unbridled (who, like Quiet American, was sired by Mr. Prospector's top sire son Fappiano). In spite of his own Mr. Prospector inbreeding, Tapit has thrived with mares carrying Mr. Prospector in their own pedigrees, and Malibu Moon, Congrats, and Flatter have similarly done well with inbreeding to that line. As for Bernardini, he has sired 2015 Champagne Stakes (G1) winner Greenpointcrusader, 2016 Nashua Stakes (G2) winner Hemsworth, 2012 Holy Bull Stakes (G3) winner Algorithms, and 2016 Gotham Stakes (G3) winner Shagaf from mares returning Fappiano, and Hemsworth and Shagaf are both out of mares by Unbridled's Song.



Although A.P. Indy did not do particularly well with mares by Storm Cat, his sons and grandsons have shown more of an affinity for this line. This cross has the obvious hook of creating inbreeding to the great Secretariat, the broodmare sire of A.P. Indy and Storm Cat. It also tends to be a good one from a conformation standpoint, as the cross adds Storm Cat's strong hip and musculature to the height and classic scope typical of the A.P. Indy line. In Astrology's case, his height and scope are also influenced by his broodmare sire Quiet American, a horse who combined miler speed with good bone, overall length, and a generally rugged make.

“When we acquired Astrology, we wanted a second horse to complement Court Vision—a little bit different visually and in type,” says David Tillson of Acadiana Equine@Copper Crowne. “Astrology is tall and stands over a lot of ground, but when you look at him closely, he's surprisingly short-coupled. He's actually the type of horse that can benefit from moving away from Kentucky, where you have all those classic-

type mares. Here in a regional market, you have a lot of mares that are shorter and more speed-oriented. Astrology had plenty of speed, and with that short coupling, he's just the sort of stallion you need to put a bit more leg and scope into the kind of mares you often see in Louisiana without losing speed in the foal. I can also see him potentially doing well with mares by Half Ours and Songandaprayer, who have both been popular here.”

Tillson also likes what he sees of Astrology's mind. “He's just like a big dog,” he says. “He's friendly and easy to handle, and he's an excellent breeding horse. I haven't had the opportunity to see too many of his foals, but the ones I have some knowledge of are a lot like him: smart and friendly. He did really well at the last Opelousas sale, and he had a \$260,000 filly at Keeneland September, so he's the total package: a horse whose foals can make you some money selling or on the track.”

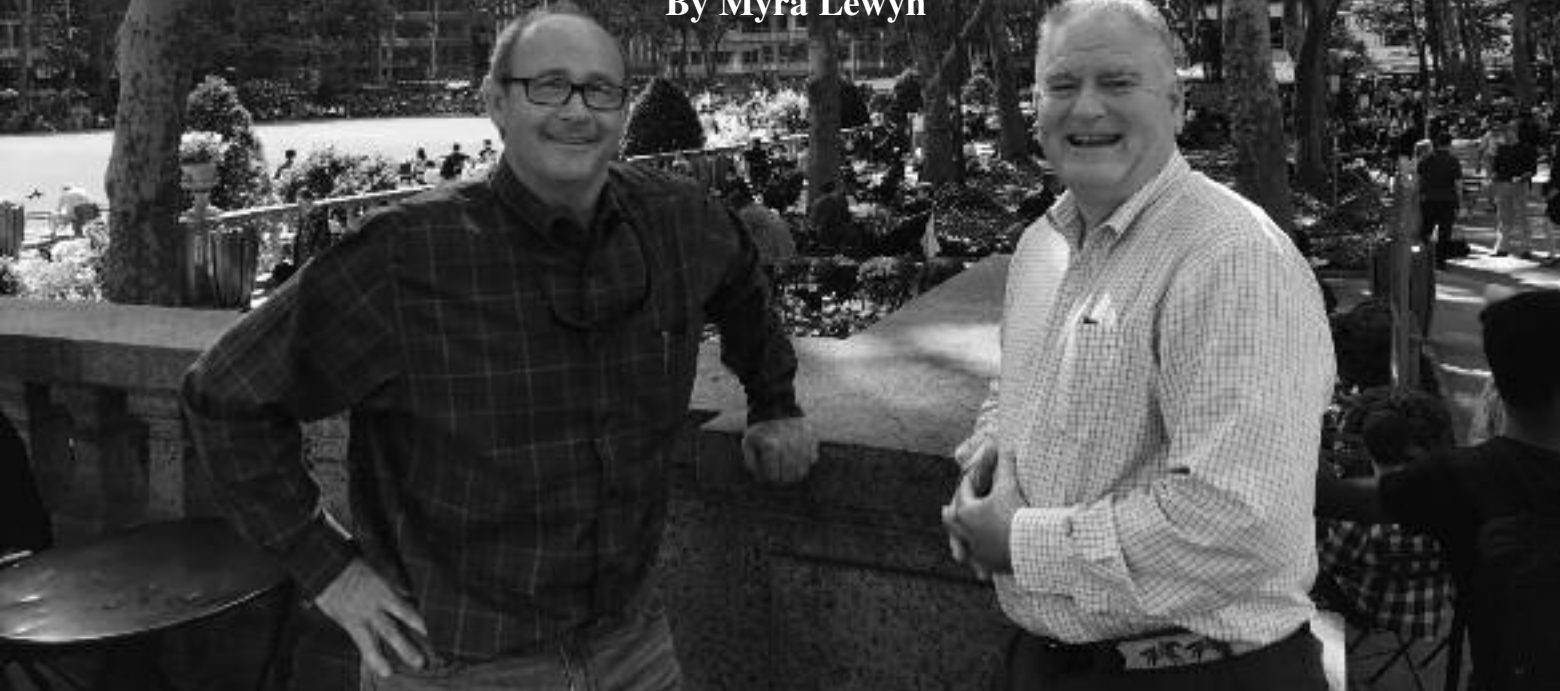

Big World Meant the World to Friends

The breeding of Louisiana-bred Grade 1 winner Big World was years in the making through a partnership between two good friends whose fathers also were actively involved in the state's racing and breeding industry.

Louisiana cotton grower Curt Leake and Louisiana native-turned Kentucky horseman Jody Huckabay bred Big World, the first home-grown top-level winner since Stewart Madison's Happy Ticket won the 2005 Ballerina Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course and a smashing commercial market success after her high-dollar sale to Japanese interests last fall.

Leake is the son of Tensas Parish

farmer Sam Leake, whose auction purchase of Big World's grandam in 2000 proved fortuitous; and Huckabay, originally from Shreveport, is the son of physician and longtime owner and breeder Jackie Huckabay, both now deceased.

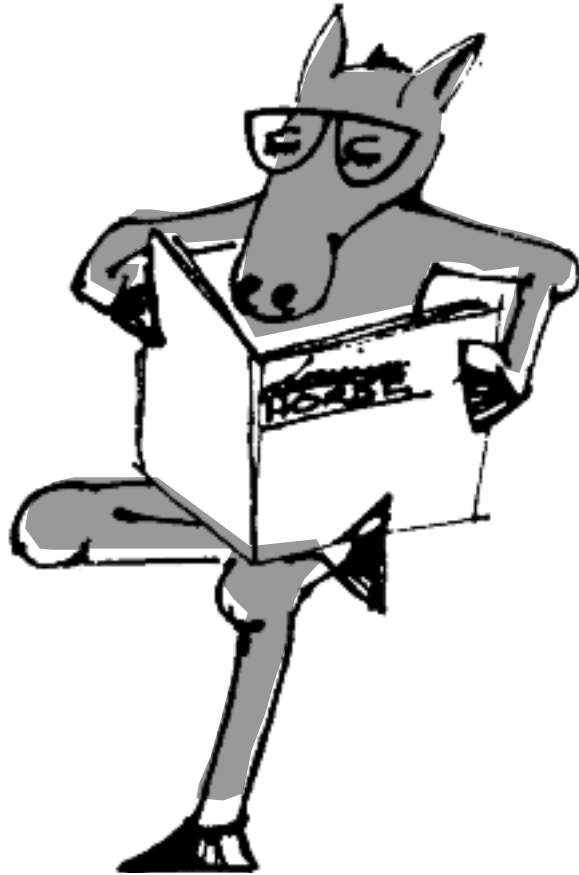
Big World won the 2016 Tempted Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct as a juvenile and capped a four-race win streak, including two Louisiana-bred stakes at Fair Grounds and Delta Downs, with a tour-de-force triumph in the 2017 La Troienne (G1) at Churchill Downs for owner Maggi Moss, who bought her for \$98,000 at the 2014 OBS August yearling sale.

She finished on the board in 12 of 13 career starts, winning seven races, while earning \$629,190 in purses for Moss. Leake and Huckabay also reaped rewards – 18% of each purse she earned – via the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association breeder awards program.

Moss, the nation's leading owner by races won in 2006, said the filly's La Troienne victory was the highlight of her career as an owner.

Huckabay steadied his voice as he recalled watching the race.

"It tears me up. That's what we get up every morning to do," he said. "To be able to raise a horse of the year, foaled in Louisiana, to win

a grade 1 race was just a very emotional deal for me and Curt as well...for both of our fathers we thought so much of and wished they could have been here to witness that.

“My father was instrumental in the Louisiana program for many, many years,” said Huckabay, who owns the near-700 acre Elm Tree Farm in Paris, Kentucky. “I moved up (to Kentucky) in 1987, and after he passed 15 years ago we’ve had a fair amount of success including with some of the Louisiana horses we’ve had. I wanted to pay homage to those two men for as much as they had to do with the state of Louisiana.”

The elder Huckabay owned

and/or bred a number of Louisiana stakes winners, including Mr. Excellent, Marfa Missile, Rose Is Bold, Chief Ruling, Courtin Ann, Pacific Sun, Piece of Pacific, and Old Lee.

Foaled at Clear Creek Stud, Big World is by the farm’s leading sire Custom for Carlos out of the unraced Broken Vow mare Tensas Wedding Joy, whose dam Xylophone, by Dehere, was bought by Sam Leake for \$25,000 from Lane’s End, agent, at the 2000 Keeneland November sale. Tensas Wedding Joy is a half-sister to multiple Louisiana stakes winner Tensas Yucatan as well as a pair of stakes-placed runners, all bred by Sam Leake.

Now a member of the broodmare band at Town and Country Farms in Georgetown, Kentucky, Tensas Wedding Joy has Dialed In filly foaled in April this year and was bred to champion dual hemisphere stallion More Than Ready, sire of Custom for Carlos, for 2019. The partners kept and plan to race her Trappe Shot filly, now a two-year-old named Newellton in training with Rodolphe Brisset at Keeneland.

The Leakes and Huckabays met by chance in the late 1980s when dining at a Little Rock, Arkansas restaurant the eve of a horse sale. Sitting at a table next to the Huckabays, the Leakes were drawn in by horse talk.

“We started a pretty good relationship outside of horses by way of skeet shooting and duck hunting,” Leake said. “We shared philosophies; we’re about honesty and integrity and doing what you say you’re going to do. And that wasn’t only in horses, it was in everything. The way we met them was just the luck of the draw.”

It was also good fortune that Leake credited for the mating of Tensas Wedding Joy and Custom for Carlos.

“I could say I looked at (the mating) and we felt like this was best, but really I liked Custom for Carlos when he came in. I liked the way he looked. Tensas Wedding Joy was a nice-looking mare; it just seemed to me they’d fit. And then all of a sudden when this baby came she was a knockout from the beginning. As far as me being smart enough (to plan the mating) we just got lucky.”

Leake, who grows cotton and soybeans on 6,000 acres in Tensas Parish, said he was the spark plug that ignited his father’s interest in Thoroughbreds.

“Dad saw my passion for it so he jumped in with me,” he said. “We were just joined at the hip mostly and then as we progressed into our relationship with the Huckabays it made it very easy to become partners with them.”

Bluewater Sales sold Big World for \$725,000 to Katsumi Yoshida of Japan’s Northern Farm at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton November mixed sale. The price is the highest ever for a Louisiana-bred. She is in foal to Deep Impact, a son of Sunday Silence who has been Japan’s leading sire since 2012.

While Leake said he was a bit surprised at her price, Huckabay said he was not.

“She’s such a big, good-looking

mare, a grade 1 winner,” he said. “I wished she would have stayed in this country, but I had suspicions that’s what would happen. I think she could be a really good broodmare.”

This year, the friends claimed a Broken Vow mare named Dixie Jewel and hope to catch lightning in bottle with the same cross Big World is bred on. After breeding her to Upstart this year, she will be bred back to Custom for Carlos.

“We’ve proven that Louisiana-breds can compete anywhere in the world,” Huckabay said. “With the Japanese buying Big World, there’s many other horses that are Louisiana-bred that are competing around the country and holding their own. Way back when I couldn’t say that. I think they’ve improved the breed a tremendous amount.”

The RRP held its fourth annual Thoroughbred Makeover October 4-7, 2018 in Lexington, Kentucky. The 2018 RRP Thoroughbred Makeover had 23 Louisiana breds entered in the competition, more than double the number that competed in the 2017 event. This year Louisiana breds competed in Barrel Racing, Competitive Trail, Dressage, Eventing, Field Hunter, Freestyle, Ranch Work, Show Hunter, and Show Jumper disciplines.

Retired Louisiana bred thoroughbred racehorses showed up in the top ranks in many of the ten different disciplines represented

with Interactif Spy earning the number one spot in the Show Jumper category. Interactif Spy, a 2013 gelding (Interactif-Runaway Spy), was bred in Louisiana by D&F Horse Farms LLC, and ridden by Morgan Boyer, a professional from North Carolina. On the racetrack, Interactif Spy started three times as a 3-year-old, with one win and a second place finish. He retired with racetrack earnings of \$9,305.

Boyer said of off-the-track thoroughbreds, “Honestly I don’t think they’re for everyone because they’re very forward thinking, but that translates very well to a working horse. It translates incredibly well to eventing. They’re catty and athletic; they’re cooperative. They just have the brain to try really hard. They’re so, so smart.”

Another Louisiana bred, Delightfully, a 2014 mare (Redding Collier-Like a Lover), earned third place in the Freestyle discipline. Delightfully was bred in Louisiana by Columbine Stable, LLC, and ridden by Amy Lent, a professional from Kentucky. Delightfully was unsuccessful in her one bid on the racetrack and retired with earnings of \$1,230.

An unplaced Louisiana bred gelding Bazillion Bells (Calibrachoa-Zada Rae), earned sixth place in the Eventing discipline for professional competitor Kaitlin Hartford of Florida. Bazillion Bells was bred by Joseph Adcock.

The Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association (LTBA)

sponsored a \$2,500 cash prize for the top-placed Louisiana-bred at the competition.

“The Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association continues to make an investment in the future of our thoroughbreds by helping our former runners secure a beautiful life after their time on the racetrack is done,” said Roger Heitzmann III, secretary-treasurer of LTBA. “We believe that by assisting the Retired Racehorse Project, former racers have the ability to show to others the true beauty of the Thoroughbred, as well as their continued usefulness.”

If you are looking for a great horse to compete in the RRP, LHRA has several horses that are “RRP eligible”. Horses adopted from LHRA have been successful in many disciplines and are a great testament to our program in general. We appreciate your support and could not do it without you! THE RACEHORSE WHO BECAME A SAINT

Louisiana bred gets a winning makeover

Interactif Spy is a champion with an alias.

The 5-year-old gelding won the show jumping division of the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover in October. In doing so, he also won

\$2,500 from the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association for being the highest-placed Louisiana-bred in the competition.

Interactif Spy, by Interactif out of the unraced mare Runaway Spy by Mount Livermore, ran three times as a 3-year-old at Louisiana Downs in 2016. He ran second,

then fifth and finally first in a maiden special weight event. He was bred by Frank and Dianne Bruscato of Monroe, dba D and F Farm, and was trained by Frank's cousin Andrew Cascio.

After that maiden win, Frank says, Interactif Spy was retired with a tendon problem and given away

to a woman in Oklahoma who was supposed to find him a good home. He heard nothing more until the Retired Racehorse Project contacted him to say that Interactif Spy was entered in the Makeover.

“I think it’s a great deal because these Thoroughbreds get a new career. This horse, he’s not very big, you know, 15.2. He’s got two bowed tendons. They’re not really bad, but he’s not able to run anymore. But he has certainly surprised the heck out of me,” Bruscato says. “It’s certainly been a pleasure to hear about his success.”

So why is the horse now known as “Saint,” and how did he end up in North Carolina? Well, this is the murky part of the story.

Morgan Boyer and her mother Jammie Hand own and manage Blue Line Sport Horses in Reidsville, N.C. (Hand is the official owner of Interactif Spy.) Blue Line specializes in retraining off-track Thoroughbreds for second careers, mainly in eventing. Eventing combines dressage, cross country jumping and show jumping to test the versatility, endurance and athleticism of the horse.

“I love the Thoroughbreds.” Boyer says. “I love their heart. I love their charm. I’ve done some other breeds. They just don’t click as well as the Thoroughbreds do, I guess.”

While warmbloods dominate some of the equine sports outside racing, Boyer says Thoroughbreds have become much more popular in

American eventing in the last couple of years. “They’ve definitely become huge in the eventing world,” she said. “They just have so much try to them.”

Boyer found a horse she liked on Facebook named No More Saint. (Equibase records show the existence of a Louisiana-bred named No More Saint but it’s unknown if this was the same horse.) No More Saint was a bay, 16.2-hand gelding located in what Boyer described as a feed lot in Ohio, and was being marketed by a third party.

Boyer’s mother went to Ohio to pick up the horse, but the horse that came off the trailer in North Carolina was 15.2, considerably shorter than what Boyer wanted as an eventing prospect. There was also the matter of the tendons, and that wasn’t all.

“His hind legs were crazy beat up. They were swollen like tree trunks. He was probably 100 to 150 pounds underweight,” she says. She rode him once and turned him out, calling him Saint for what should have been the obvious reason.

“About a week later the third-party trader sends us a message: Oh, by the way, that’s not Saint No More,” Boyer recalls. The trader sent along a Coggins, some research ensued and the horse was proven to be Interactif Spy. But the alias, Saint, stuck.

Saint was jumpy and didn’t like to be touched. Boyer’s first ride was not promising.

“He was a mess. His head was up



in the air. I didn’t know if we were trotting or cantering or pacing. We weren’t walking, that’s for sure. He was just so wound tight.”

Since Saint needed to relax and Boyer and her mother were in the process of closing on a new farm, out in the pasture he went. In February, she started him back with stretching and softening exercises, with the intention of getting him into shape to sell.

After a few rides, something “clicked,” she says. She could tell that he hadn’t jumped before, but he loved it. Soon he was jumping 2’6”. Today, he loves to jump and to touch people with his nose, but he never nips or bites.

“Into fences and over fences he has just always carried a very natural step,” she says. “He picked it up faster than anything I’ve ever ridden.”

The Thoroughbred Makeover competition at the Kentucky Horse Park is a rapidly growing event designed to showcase second careers for horses whose racing days are over. Nearly 500 horses competed this year in specially designed divisions including show jumping, show hunters, field hunters, dressage, freestyle, barrel racing, polo, ranch work and competitive trail.

In addition to the \$100,000 overall prize money, several states in addition to Louisiana offered special awards to their highest-placing state-breds. A couple of dozen Louisiana-breds participated.

To be eligible, horses must have raced or recorded a published work after July 16, 2016, and cannot have begun training for their second careers before Dec. 1, 2017. The requirements test a trainer’s ability to get Thoroughbreds restarted correctly in new careers as well as the horse’s potential and adaptability.

Show jumping was judged on style over fences and on potential as a show jumper. Horses showed both over fences and on the flat. Neither speed nor height was emphasized although Saint was one of relatively few horses to jump 3’3”.

Boyer said more than 100 horses entered the show jumping divi-

sions. Among them was Cozmic One, the first foal out of champion race mare Zenyatta. By Bernardini, the blue-blooded foal was eagerly awaited by the racing world but never ran better than fourth in five starts. Now a gelding, Cozmic One finished fifth behind Interactif Spy.

Saint also competed in the eventing division, finishing 28th out of some 150 entries. Boyer said his dressage work needs to be more competitive and that she deliberately rides conservatively in dressage for now.

Bruscato and Boyer spoke before the Makeover. Boyer said she had never spoken with a breeder of one of her horses before. She sent photos from the event, and Bruscato said he’ll frame one. At 82, Frank still has a few horses with his wife and cousin. Runaway Spy has passed on, but he still owns a broodmare who is a half-sister to Saint.

Bruscato is impressed with what



Boyer has done. “I think that’s quite admirable, and of course Dianne and I are real happy to know that he got a new career,” he says.

In his new career, Saint has already successfully completed in horse trials through training level. As she does with all her horses, Boyer says she’ll take him as far up the levels of eventing as he wants to go.

And Saint is no longer for sale.

An impressive score in the \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Turf Classic for Kendel Standlee's In the Navy gave the four-year old Midshipman colt his first black type win and he now boasts a win at every Louisiana racetrack. After running second and third in stakes races prior, trainer Scott Gelner felt it was time for his charge to break through in a major way. "I thought he was the horse to beat today," Gelner elaborated. "His last race was very good. He ran a big race but just encountered a

lot of traffic problems. I thought he should have won that one."

Leaving from post ten under Colby Hernandez, In the Navy ensured he wouldn't have the same fate as before. The pair shot to the front of the field and sat right off the flank of pacesetter Sir Genghis. Those two engaged in a backstretch duel. Sensing it was time to move, In the Navy seized commanded around the far turn and opened what appeared to be an insurmount-

able lead. “We couldn’t ask for a better trip” explained Hernandez. “When I peeked over I saw (Magic Vow) running up and I switched sticks to the right hand and (In the Navy) responded even more.” Magic Vow finished with a rush down the lane to threaten but came up a ½ length short. Final time for the 1-1/16th mile on turf was 1:42.11. Betting favorite Sir Genghis hung on for third place.



Owner Ken Standlee, who splits his time between Kentucky and Florida, bred In the Navy from his Dixieland Band mare Southern Princess. In the Navy’s victory was his fifth win from nineteen starts and has increased his career earnings to \$160,800. “He’s just a laid back horse, trainer Gelner explained. “You can do anything you want with him.”

The \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Distaff which ran over the John Franks turf course went to Star Guitar filly, Bermuda Star for owners Evelyn and Maurice Benoit’s Brittlyn Stables. The four-year old filly made easy work of twelve rivals as she cruised under the wire by a widening four lengths. With a clean break from post position eight, under the guidance of regular rider Diego Saenz, the pair raced in mid-pack as the field was led by Ourgoldshalaylee. Bermuda Star was guided to the inside and stayed glued to the rail for her entire trip. Confident and comfortable with her rail skimming position, Bermuda Star edged into contention with a half mile to run in the 1 1/16-mile test. Not giving up an inch, Saenz cut the corner into the homestretch, powered up the rail and grabbed the lead inside the 1/8th pole. Eskenformore rallied four wide down the lane but was no match for the winner who stopped the timer in 1:42.08.

Diego Saenz, who celebrated the win with his three young daughters, Amy, Alyn and Mia, knows this filly very well after being aboard for 11 of her 13 career starts. “She really likes the rail” Saenz explained “She finished great today.”

Winning conditioner Victor Arceneaux, has been an integral part of Brittlyn Stables success and has a real familiarity with Star Guitar’s offspring. Arceneaux was the man in charge of giving four-time Louisiana-bred Horse of the Year, Star Guitar his early racing

education. “All of the Star Guitar babies that I have come across are very smart horses and this one is no different,” Arceneaux offered. “I was telling Mrs. Evelyn I was looking forward to getting (Bermuda Star) back on the turf course because I felt that’s where she runs her best races.”

The Louisiana Cup Distaff attracted a full field of 12 runners. Bermuda’s Star’s margin of victory was four lengths accomplished in the final time of 1:42.08. Bermuda Star was bred by Tom Curtis and Wayne Simpson.

The train won’t stop rolling...Bermuda Star returned to Louisiana Downs a month later and won the River Cities Stakes on the Super Derby undercard, increasing her earnings to over \$229,000.

It was not going to be easy. The field for the 40th running of the \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Sprint had a steep mountain to climb in order to capture the top prize. The public's favorite in the wagering was Ivery Sister's Monte Man and the 5-year-old gelding entered the Sprint five-for-five against Louisiana-bred competition, which included

three consecutive stakes races. The son of Custom for Carlos came out swinging under jockey Gerard Melancon with a surprise tactic of early speed. "I wasn't expecting to be on the lead but we went so slow; 23 and change," Melancon said. "Today he felt like a rocket. The first quarter of a mile was like a morning clip for him."

Decision time. Melancon was having no part in reigning his charge back. After gaining a clear advantage down the backside, Monte Man had a lot left in the tank and dealt with challengers one by one. Racing along the inside Monte Man didn't panic as Cheers to Berti rushed up to make it three abreast at the top of the lane. Melancon, confident in his charge, didn't even go to the whip down the lane. Monte Man responded to a strong hand ride and ran straight as an arrow down the

lane and held off a furious charge by Cheers to Berti to win by a "neck" in the final time of 1:10.17.

"He was really fresh today" explained Melancon "You always have a backup plan. When you're on the best horse you take the race to them."

Monte Man is trained by Ron Faucheux and the young conditioner explained how a \$25,000 claim has climbed the class ladder to a multiple stakes winner. "The key to his success has been the proper spacing of his races" remarked Faucheux "He's an easy horse to train, very easy on himself. One of the most intelligent horses I ever trained and one that exerts himself just enough to win. We are blessed with an owner that allows us to train a horse and place them accordingly. The best horse usually wins the race no matter the obstacles."

Monte Man has proven to be a consistent horse that knows how to find the winner's circle. Bred by Val Murrell at Clear Creek Stud, Monte Man (out of the Sutter's Prospect mare Sarah's My Angel) has now improved his career race record to an impressive nine wins, four seconds and three thirds from 28 starts.

When it comes to solving a puzzle—two heads are better than one. The dilemma at hand was the improving the record of Robert Lestz, Kirk and Gillian's 4-year-old mare P Boo. Leading up to the \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, P Boo

seemed to have lost her taste for winning. The Dominus mare P Boo was winless in her five starts of 2018.

Her pattern of under achievement was about to change. Quick and alert from the starting gate under jockey Thomas Pompell, P Boo went straight to the lead, took pressure from both sides down the backside and commenced a duel with Dixie Brees down the length of the stretch. P Boo surged to a narrow lead in the final strides to win by a “neck.” A rapid 1:10.17 was the clocking for six furlongs.

The man in charge of putting the pieces of the puzzle together was trainer Kirk Harris. “She ran here last fall and chipped her sesamoid,” Harris explained. “So we took a chip out last fall and gave her a break. Then we really found out she likes to go one turn, not two,” Harris offered. “Next we had to figure out how to get

her out of the gate and we got that figured out. She’s just a hard trying and fast and fierce kind of filly. You should see her in the mornings. Everybody stops and looks at her.”

Jockey Thomas Pompell deserves a tip of the hat after his belly to the leather ride in the final 100 yards. “It seemed like I was getting after her with the stick, but when I put my stick away and went to pumping on her she responded and nosed right by.”

Holding up the winner’s trophy inside the winners’ enclosure, co-owner Robert Lestz, who made the correct decision it to claim P Boo four races prior, reflected on the team effort. “It all just came together. Tommy (Pompell) gave her a great effort and Kirk (Harris) is very humble as a trainer.”

Bred by Spendthrift Farm, P Boo was produced from the Freud mare Paraiba. Paraiba raced for five seasons earning five wins and fourteen placing from thirty-five starts.

It was a family affair for Vic and Nicole Topper of Northpointe Thoroughbreds as their home-bred, Cabo’s Rumor bounded home much the best as winner of the \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Juvenile Stakes. Conditioned by Steven Duke and ridden by Emanuel Nieves, Cabo’s Rumor broke with the field

but was allowed to settle six lengths back of the lead trio which was led by Victory Trip. “This is a nice baby” Nieves said, “He’s still a little green like a young horse is suppose to be but when I asked him for his run he responded right away.” When straightened for home in the six furlong event, Cabo’s Rumor was still five lengths back. A few reminders from Nieves and the two-year old colt got into full stride down the center of the track and drove past Victory Trip who got nosed out for second by Beto.

Cabo’s Rumor’s margin of victory was an impressive three lengths accomplished in the final time of 1:13.01.

Steven Duke, whose relationship with the Toppers dates back many years, explained the history and development of Cabo’s Rumor. “I trained both his momma and his daddy,” Duke said of his juvenile

Louisiana-bred. “The Toppers purchased (Amanecer de Oro) from Tom Early at the Louisiana Yearling sale and bought the mama at the Lone Star sale as a yearling. They won stakes with both of them and now they have won a stakes with their first baby. He’s not quite as fast as Amanecer de Oro and gets his looks from his mother. Neither one of his parents are as near as big as he is. He’s just a big horse and one that we think wants more ground.”

If quality and stamina are going to be evident in the future of Cabo’s Rumor, the stamp will come from the mare The Rumor’s True. An offspring of Kafwain, The Rumor’s True won three stakes in her 2-year-old season and has been bred to Awesome Again in Kentucky.

The \$60,000 Louisiana Cup Juvenile Fillies Stakes featured a salty group of two-year-old fillies. Johnny B. Evans of Bulverde, Texas and Terry Eoff’s juvenile filly Silvercents out ran the sextet of two-year old fillies en-route to a $\frac{3}{4}$ length come from behind victory over runner up Raising the Ante.

Sasha Risenhoover, in the saddle on her birthday, relished winning aboard Silvercents for good friend Terry Eoff who she has formed a tight bond with throughout the years. “Me and the connections have done very well together, Risenhoover explained. “Today played out just as we hoped. We were in a stalking position behind the speed and when we turned for home I couldn’t ask for a better position. When I asked her to run she responded and gave it to me.”

The six-furlong test featured two heavy favorites. Atchata from the powerhouse barn of Al Stall, Jr. and Iona Guitar running for Steve Asmussen. Iona Guitar sped to the lead and ran a half mile in 46.31 before fading to last. Atchata, the winner of the D.S. Shine Young Futurity at Evangeline Downs, never seemed comfortable while chasing the leaders and faded to fifth. Meanwhile, Silvercents was reined back to watch it all unfold while running along the inside. Swung off the rail for the stretch run, Silvercents (Goldcents - Carl’s Frosty Girl, by Pulling Punches) got rolling. Still on her left lead down the lane, Silvercents went by Whodatwhodat and then switched leads in deep stretch and held Raising the Ante at bay in the final strides. Final time for the six panels was 1:12.93.

“She’s got a lot of heart. She is one of these fillies that just won’t quit,” co-owner Eoff explained “We put the blinkers on her this time to get her to focus better and it seemed to help her a little.” The heart on display from Silvercentsshowed demonstrated a distinct resemblance to her dam Carl’s Frosty Girl, who was a two-time winner of the Louisiana Champions Day Ladies Sprint at the Fairgrounds.

Silvercents was purchased for \$25,000 at the Texas Thoroughbred Association 2018 Two-Year-Old in Training Sale from her breeder Steve Holliday.

Big Gains for Consignor Select Sale

Equine Sales Company's Consignor Select Yearling Sale, held Thursday, September 6, in Opelousas, Louisiana, recorded significant increases in gross sales and average price compared to last year's auction, which itself posted big increases over the prior year. All told, 150 of 206 yearlings sold this year for a total of \$1,949,900 with an average of \$12,999 and median of \$6,000. A total of 138 of 193 head sold last year.

This year's figures marked an 19.2% increase in gross sales from last year's \$1,636,400 and a 9.6% jump in average from \$11,858. This year's median of \$6,000 was down from last year's \$7,000, and this year's buyback rate was 27.2%

compared to 28.5% last year.

"We had a very strong sale last year, so we were extremely pleased to exceed those numbers this year," said Foster Bridewell, sales director. "The fact that we had 10 horses go for \$50,000 or more proves that our consignors really brought some quality stock and that our buyers stepped up to get those individuals.

"There's a lot of money to run for in Louisiana, and Louisiana-breds have proven again and again that they can win anywhere, most recently with Classy John, who sold here as a 2-year-old for \$12,000, winning an \$85,000 maiden special at Saratoga last month by daylight."

The sale was highlighted by two Louisiana-bred colts who hit six figures, topped by a February foal

from the first crop of multiple Grade 1 winner Palace. Consigned by 4M Ranch, agent, the colt went to J. Stevens Bloodstock, agent, for \$105,000. He is out of the winning Kafwain mare Sheer Speed, whose first starter, by Redding Colliery, is a two-time winner.

Close behind the sale-topper was a March foal by Grade 1 winner and first-crop sire Lea who sold for \$100,000 from Red River Farm, agent, to Carl Moore Management LLC. The colt is out the unraced Corinthian daughter Beat the Street, who is the dam of four winners from as many to race including stakes winner Kylie's Cutie and stakes-placed Blue Ribbon Girl.

The Equine Sales Company Open Yearling and Mixed Sale, held Oct. 28 got off to a strong start with a pair of Louisiana-bred yearling fillies bringing \$50,000 apiece early in the auction. Final results showed big increases from 2017.

All told, the yearling and mixed sessions combined for sales of \$333,100 with 85 of 126 head sold for an average price of \$3,919. Last year's auction reported gross sales of \$203,350 with 84 of 183 sold with an average of \$2,421. Last

year's top-seller came in at \$17,000.

"It was great to see the upward trend continue in Louisiana after we had a very successful select yearling sale in September," said Foster Bridewell, sales director. "Having two horses bring \$50,000 is a big deal for the open yearling and mixed sale."

The first filly to bring \$50,000 was hip 10, a daughter of Proud Citizen who sold to Charles Castille from the consignment of Brown's

Thoroughbred Farm. Named Gator Proud, the April filly is a full sister to multiple Grade 3 winner Miz Ida out of the stakes winning, G3-placed mare May Gator.

The other \$50,000 filly was hip 18, Blessed Anna, who sold to Virginia Lazenby from Select Sales, agent for Coteau Grove Farms LLC. The February foal is from the first crop of the Medaglia d'Oro stallion Fast Anna and out of Pleasantly Blessed, a multiple stakes winner by Pleasant Tap.

PREPARING THE YOUNG STALLION FOR BREEDING

Most young stallions that begin a breeding career have already proven themselves in a racing or performance career. If the young horse has done well on the racetrack during his 2 and 3-year-old years, for instance, he may begin breeding mares as a 4-year-old. Before entering the breeding shed, he needs some retraining, a fertility evaluation, and some time to refocus on his new job and prepare for his first breeding season.

Larry McGinnis, stallion manager at WinStar Farm in Kentucky says this may take longer for some young stallions than others. “When we first get them off the track, they’ve been told all their life not to rear up or try to mount mares. They had to have good manners for their racing career. So when I get them, and they are first presented with a mare, they may be confused, and wonder what they are supposed to do. They might look at you as if you are trying to set them up for trouble, and they may be reluctant at first,” he says.

“Some of them change gears quickly, and the first trip to the breeding shed they’ll breed a mare, but it generally takes a little time. It might be the first trip, or it might be the 6th trip before they feel comfortable about it. The urge to breed takes over, and instinct kicks in, and they go ahead and jump on that mare,” says McGinnis.

“I had one young stallion get up

on his first mare and just start looking around—as if he thought it was a neat view from up there! He wasn’t sure what to do. Some will try to jump from the side. But the main thing is to make sure their first attempt is a positive experience,” he explains.

“For their first trip to the breeding shed we often use a mare that’s been overiectamized and we give her a shot of synthetic estradiol to bring her into heat. Then the young horse can do whatever he wants to as he figures things out, and the mare is not going to kick him. I don’t want him to have any setbacks or a bad experience that might make him think he doesn’t like to breed mares,” says McGinnis.

“Then once he starts breeding mares, you’ve opened up some new challenges. He knows what the breeding shed is for. The second time you take him down there to breed, he needs to learn a few manners, but you need to teach him gently. You don’t want him to be bad, but you also don’t want to discourage breeding behavior. We want him to be eager to breed a mare, but we don’t want him to be out of control or savaging the mare. He still needs some manners, and it’s a fine line. My guy who handles the stallions, Israel Romo, is very good at helping that horse or teaching that horse, without going too far.”

“We work together at the breeding shed, to make sure we end up with a good breeding horse that’s

not savaging mares. He can act like a stallion but he still has to be a gentleman when he comes to breed a mare. He needs to breed the mare, respect her, get back off her, and go back to his barn with no problems,” says McGinnis.

This training program is continually fine-tuned, and the young stallion may be allowed to breed 20 to 30 times before the breeding season starts. “I’ve had stallions that I know won’t be a problem, and I may wait on them awhile because that’s all he’s going to think about because he’s already a little bit studdish. We just fine-tune those stallions a little bit closer to the actual breeding season,” he explains.

“When we get into the season, we work closely with these stallions. This is something they’ve never done before and they use some muscles they’ve never used before. Their back muscles, may get sore. We have to watch them and make sure they are breeding ok. They’ll tell us, and sometimes a horse that isn’t breeding very well just needs a little break after he gets a month into it. He doesn’t need a lot of time off, but maybe just breed one mare every two days until he feels 100% again,” McGinnis says.

“And sometimes you can’t give them much of a break and just have to go ahead and breed them. The horses that breed well and handle it easily, we just continue on with, but you need to know the horse,” he says.

The first two years of a young stallion's breeding career are learning experiences for the horse and for the handlers. "We put them in different situations through that first year, and learn about the things that horse likes and doesn't like. Some can't breed 4 days in a row and you find out what works best for them and what doesn't work. It's a learning curve for the first couple years, and the horse improves in many ways. He's usually a better breeding horse, knows what to expect when he goes to the breeding shed, and is more confident in what he's doing," McGinnis says.

"By the third year, it's easy because you know what this horse can do, and you can sometimes push him a bit and then give him a break. You know what you need to do, to make him successful for the rest of the season. That helps, when talking with our clients, the farm manager and general manager. We know what we'll need to do, to keep that horse going." You don't want him to burn out or have a problem and not be able to breed as many mares.

"The demands on a first year

stallion keep him very busy. You walk a fine line, to keep everybody happy. We usually manage to do that, but sometimes the horse needs a break or he's just not liking what he's doing at that time and we have to do something a little different," says McGinnis.

The young stallion is first evaluated when he comes off the race-track, looking at basic fertility, testicle size, etc. "Then after we breed him a few times we can get an accurate sperm count. We have our reproductive specialist come in and collect the stallion with an AV (artificial vagina) and look at semen samples. By that point in time the semen is usually good; we hardly ever get one that has only fair or poor semen quality. These stallions are generally capable of handling whatever number of mares we are getting ready for them to breed," he says.

The main thing is just getting the novice stallions prepared mentally and physically. "This also means

getting a little more weight on them. They were very fit, for racing, and we want them to have more fat. It takes energy for breeding, they will be burning a lot of calories, and we don't want to run them down. We try to get some extra weight on them, and then keep track of them during the breeding season. If they need more feed or turnout time, or whatever—to make them better physically—we will do," says McGinnis.

It's a matter of closely monitoring, and doing whatever is necessary for that particular horse. "Sometimes our stallions are checked again the next morning, after they breed their last mare, to evaluate whether they need to stay in or get turned out. We prefer to turn them out, with room to exercise, but sometimes it takes these young stallions time to adjust to turnout. They've been in a stall most of their life, and a few of them won't lie down outside." They are all individuals and you just have to manage them the best way you can, for that particular horse.

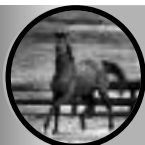

Country Day Moves to Stand at Peach Lane Farms

Breeders Cup placed multiple stakes winner Country Day is moving to Lora Pitre's Peach Lane Farms in Opelousas for the 2019 breeding season.

Country Day captured three stakes and placed in five others. He finished second in the 2011 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (gr. II) in which he was beaten 1 1/2 lengths. Country Day, who raced at nine tracks, won on dirt, turf, and synthetic surfaces. He recorded a 105 Beyer speed figure when scoring by six lengths at Fair Grounds at 3 and a 102 when winning the Hot Springs Stakes at Oaklawn Park the following year. Country Day was retired with a record of 7-4-2 from 19 starts and earnings of \$503,829.

The son of Speightstown out of the graded stakes winning Mt. Livermore mare Hidden Assets entered stud in 2013 at Pope McLean's Crestwood Farm near Lexington for Bertram, Elaine, and Richard Klein who campaigned him during his racing career. Country Day is a half brother to multiple stakes winners Due Date and Good Deed and traces back in female family to Calumet Farm's blue hen Blue Delight, whose other descendants include major winner and sire Alydar.

With his third crop being two-year-olds of 2018, Country Day already has a graded stakes winner, Will Call to his credit. Will Call,

from Country Day's first crop, won the 2018 G3 Twin Spires Turf Sprint S. at Churchill Downs and currently has a record of 11-6-1-1 with \$271,837 in earnings. Additionally, from his second crop, Sir Brogan is a stakes placed winner.

"Mr. Klein and I have had a business relationship for several years. He's a class act and a pleasure to work with. I am very excited about this new Country Day partnership and appreciate his continued support of the Louisiana Bred Program," says Pitre.

Country Day is standing for a 2019 fee of \$2,000 live foal payable when foal stands and nurses for owners Richard Klein and Lora Pitre. Special consideration will be given to stakes mares.

G1SW Daaher to Stand at Circle H

G1 Cigar Mile H. winner Daaher is moving from Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky to Circle H Farms in Abbeville, Louisiana for the 2019 breeding season.

A 2004 son of Awesome Again out of the stakes winning Irish Open mare Irish Cherry, Daaher won the G1 Cigar Mile Handicap at Aqueduct by 2 1/2 lengths, earning a 114 Beyer Speed Rating in the process at age three. The same year he won the G2 Jerome Handicap at Belmont by 2 1/4 lengths, earning a 110 Beyer for his effort.

With 8 crops of racing age, Daaher is the sire of 8 blacktype winners including G2 stakes winner Gypsy Robin (\$598,900) G2

placed stakes winner Clothes Fall Off (\$485,660) and 2018 multiple stakes winner One Last Empress.

In an agreement between Shadwell Farm and Circle H Farms, Daaher will be standing for a 2019 fee of \$3,000 Live Foal.

Broberg, Thornton Repeat As EVD Titleists

Perennial Evangeline Downs leading trainer Karl Broberg won his eighth training title at the Opelousas track. His main jockey for much of the summer, Tim Thornton, parlayed that partnership into a second straight riding crown for the season, which concluded August 26.

Broberg's starters won 59 of 170 starts for a winning percentage of 35%, earning \$761,440 in purse money along the way. When you include 49 other top three results for Broberg's runners, that translates into a 64% in-the-money percentage for the season. Broberg finished 27 victories ahead of Sam Breaux, who was second in the standings with 32 wins.

The complete top 10 trainers' standings were: Broberg (59 wins), Breaux (32), Allen Milligan (31), Scott Gelner (28), Brett Brinkman (27), Brian Huval (25), Sam David, Jr. and Dale White, Sr. (tied at 22), Allen Landry (21) and a three-way tie for 10th between Howard Alonzo, Lee Thomas and Shane Wilson at 18 wins each.

Tim Thornton was the jockey used most often by Karl Broberg during the 2018 Thoroughbred season at Evangeline Downs and that pairing helped Thornton, a Louisiana native, claim his second title in a row here with 141 wins from 555 starts for a winning percentage of 25%, with his mounts earning \$1,966,892 in purse money. Former Evangeline Downs riding champion Colby Hernandez posted a solid season as well, fin-

ishing second with 122 wins.

The complete top 10 jockeys' standings were: Thornton (141 wins), Hernandez (122), Diego Saenz (121), Ashley Broussard and Gerard Melancon (tied at 44), Roberto Morales and Wallynette Rodriguez (tied at 38), Thomas Pompell (32), Steve Bourque (25) and Luis Negrón (23).

As a contrast to the trainers' and jockeys' standings, the owners' standings produced a new champion for the 2018 season. Texas-based Keene Thoroughbreds, LLC of Danny Keene came to Evangeline Downs with a strong collection of runners for the first time and took the title with 31 victories from 142 starts for a winning percentage of 22%. Keene's runners earned \$314,545 in purse money for the season. End Zone

Athletics, Inc. of Karl Broberg and Matt Johanson, who won the owners' crown in 2017, finished second this year with 28 wins.

The complete top 10 owners' standings were: Keene Thoroughbreds, LLC (31 wins), End Zone Athletics, Inc. (28), Red Rose Racing (20), Circle H Farms (13), Elite Thoroughbred Racing, LLC and Whispering Oaks Farm, LLC (tied at 12), Wayne T. Davis and Norman Stables, LLC (tied at 11) and a tie for ninth between Brittlyn Stable, Inc. and Earl and Keith Hernandez and John Duvieilh at nine wins each.


Louisiana Downs Wraps 2018 Thoroughbred Meet

The 2018 Thoroughbred racing season at Harrah's Louisiana Downs concluded September 26.

Both major racing events, Louisiana Cup Day and Super Derby Day, featured excellent fields and were well received by both horsemen and horseplayers here and across the country.

Louisiana Downs handled \$64,565,651 throughout the meet, versus \$67,290,466 in the 2017 live Thoroughbred racing season. While there was a decline of 4% in total handle, there were several positives, including an increase of 12% on Super Derby Day with horseplayers wagering \$1,943,318 million this year, versus \$1,737,269 in 2017. With carryovers on both the Pick 5 and Pick 6 wagers the handle on the final day of the meet was the largest at Harrah's Louisiana Downs since the 2016 Super Derby. Also, an increase of 3.2% was noted on handle per race,

with an average of \$109,619 wagered per race this year, compared to \$106,136 last year.

“We are encouraged by the increase in our per race handle and the momentum that we saw at the end of the meet, highlighted by the very strong closing day handle,” said Eric Halstrom, Director of Operations.

Nieves, Broberg Win 2018 Louisiana Downs Titles

Emanuel Nieves had an exceptional season, topping a very competitive jockey colony to claim his first ever leading rider title. The 25-year-old native of Puerto Rico finished the meet with a record of 420 starts, 85 wins, 76 seconds and 70 thirds and purses of \$1,074,804.

Nieves began riding in 2012, and has ridden in each of the four Louisiana racetracks for the past six years.

Gerardo Mora, finished second with 67 trips to the winner’s circle. Mora was last year’s leading rider. Joel Dominguez won 66 races to finish a close third in the standings, followed by Jose Guerrero, who piloted 43 winners.

Karl Broberg added another title to his fast growing list, winning 31 races from 101 starters to top his fellow conditioners this meet.

This showing caps his dominant year in Louisiana, when he began the year with 83 wins at Delta Downs to capture his seventh consecutive leading trainer award. On August 28, he picked up his eighth training title at Evangeline Downs with 59 wins from 190 starters.

This was the second leading trainer title at Harrah’s Louisiana Downs for Broberg, who has been training since 2009.

Broberg, who is prominent at

several racetracks in the region, acknowledged the hard work of assistant trainer, Kevin Martin, who ran the Louisiana Downs string.

Joey Foster, who won the training title last year, finished second with 26 wins. Al Stall, Jr. won 22 races this meet and H. B. Johnson, Beverly Burress and Jorge Lara each saddled 18 winners.

The very tight battle for leading owner honors concluded on Tuesday afternoon when End Zone Athletics, Inc. won with Sun And Sand to clinch the title.

The highly successful partnership of Karl Broberg and Matt Johanson has reigned supreme on a national level and in the Texas-Louisiana region for many years and won 15 races this meet to earn leading owner honors.

End Zone Athletics, Inc. has led the nation in wins for the last three years. They won the title at Delta Downs earlier this year for the sixth time in the last seven years. They also won leading owner honors earlier this year at Sam Houston Race Park.

Dream Walkin Farms, Inc. followed closely with 14 wins and horses owned by Patti Turner made 13 trips to the winner’s circle. Indian Creek Thoroughbred Farms, LLC was fourth with ten wins and Beverly Burress won nine races in the 2018 Thoroughbred meet.

SALES NEWS

LA Bred Filly Tops TX Yearling and Mixed Sale

A Louisiana-bred filly by Songandaprayer topped the yearling session of the 2018 Texas Summer Yearling and Mixed Sale at Lone Star Park on August 27.

Held jointly by the Texas Thoroughbred Association and the track, the auction reported 44 of 82 yearlings sold for a total of \$414,300. The median jumped 72.2 percent from last year’s mark of \$4,500, and the average dropped from \$11,556 to \$9,415 this year. The buy-back rate this year was 46.3 percent.

Last year the yearling session grossed \$681,800 with 59 of 90 sold.

Susan Naylor signed the ticket on the sale-topper with a price of \$30,000 on hip 83. The March filly from the consignment of Clear Creek Stud, agent, is out of the stakes-placed Lion Heart mare Those Lion Eyes, whose one foal to race is a winner.

“Obviously we would have liked to see some bigger numbers today, but overall the middle and lower-end of the market seemed fine,” said Tim Boyce, sales director. “We just didn’t have the really exceptional individuals we had last year, so the average was down a bit but it’s encouraging that the median jumped almost 75 percent. It was also good to see the mixed session numbers jump compared to last year.”

In the mixed session this year, 18 of 24 head sold for \$93,100 with an average of \$5,172 and a median of \$2,350. Those numbers compared favorably to last year’s mixed session that grossed \$30,000 with 13 of 36 head sold for an average of \$2,357 and median of \$1,400.

The highest-priced horse in the mixed session was a weanling filly by Too Much Bling who sold for \$19,000 to Naylor from the consignment of Benchmark Training Center, agent for the Estate of Ed

Few. A good portion of the mixed session was composed of horses from Few, one of the state's leading breeders and owners who passed away in April.

The Texas 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale is next up on the sale calendar at Lone Star and will be held April 9.

The Jockey Club estimates an additional 3,000 to 4,000 mares will be reported as bred during the 2018 breeding season.

this time in 2017, and the number of mares bred decreased 5.0% from the 31,863 reported last year. The number of stallions covering 125 or more mares increased from 60 in 2017 to 62 in 2018.

Further book size analysis shows a 3.0% increase in the number of mares bred to stallions with a book size of 125 or more in 2018 when compared to 2017 as reported at this time last year; a 1.4% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 100 and 124; a 7.0% increase in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 75 and 99; a 6.7% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 50 and 74; a 9.6% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 25 and 49; and a 16.7% decrease in mares

bred to stallions with a book size fewer than 25.

The percentage of broodmares covered by large book size (125 or more) stallions increased from 29.4% in 2017 to 31.9% in 2018. From 2015-2017, this percentage had remained constant at approximately 29%, up from 20.5% in 2014.

The proportion of stallions with book sizes of 125 or more mares grew from 3.1% in 2014 to 4.5% from 2015-2017. In 2018, this proportion increased to 5.1%. (See Table A)

The stallion Into Mischief led all stallions with 245 mares bred in 2018. Rounding out the top five by number of RBMs were Cupid, 223; Klimt, 222; Practical Joke, 220; and, Violence, 214.

Kentucky traditionally leads North America in Thoroughbred breeding activity. During 2018, Kentucky's 228 reported stallions covered 17,322 mares, or 57.2% of all of the mares reported bred in North America. The number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions increased 0.3% percent compared with the 17,275 reported at this time last year.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by number of mares reported bred in 2018, Kentucky, California, Maryland, and Pennsylvania stallions covered more mares in 2018 than in 2017, as reported at this time last year. Table B shows the top 10 states and provinces ranked by number of mares reported bred in 2018.

The Jockey Club Releases 2017 Breeding Statistics

The Jockey Club reported Monday, October 01, 2018 that 1,778 stallions covered 34,288 mares in North America during 2017, according to statistics compiled through Sept. 26, 2018. These breedings have resulted in 21,130 live foals of 2018 being reported to The Jockey Club on Live Foal Reports.

The Jockey Club estimates that the number of live foals reported so far is approximately 90 percent complete. The reporting of live foals of 2018 is down 2.3 percent from last year at this time when The Jockey Club had received reports for 21,624 live foals of 2017.

In addition to the 21,130 live foals of 2018 reported through Sept. 26, The Jockey Club also received 2,516 No Foal Reports for the 2018 foaling season. Ultimately, the 2018 registered foal



crop is projected to reach 21,500. The number of stallions declined 4.6 percent from the 1,863 reported for 2016 at this time last year, while the number of mares bred declined 4.9 percent from the 36,045 reported for 2016.

The 2017 breeding statistics are available alphabetically by stallion name through the Resources – Fact Book link on The Jockey Club homepage at jockeyclub.com.

“It is important to note that the live foals reported in The Jockey Club breeding statistics are by conception area and do not represent the state in which a foal was born,” said Matt Iuliano, executive vice president and executive director, The Jockey Club. “Breeding statistics also are not a representation of a stallion’s fertility record.”

Kentucky annually leads all states and provinces in terms of Thoroughbred breeding activity. Kentucky-based stallions accounted for 50.7 percent of the mares reported bred in North America in 2017 and 58.5 percent of the live foals reported for 2018.

The 17,401 mares reported bred to 235 Kentucky stallions in 2017 have produced 12,370 live foals, a 0.2 percent decrease on the 12,396 Kentucky-sired live foals of 2017 reported at this time last year. The number of mares reported bred to Kentucky stallions in 2017 decreased 2.9 percent compared to the 17,912 reported for 2016 at this time last year.

Among the 10 states and provinces with the most mares covered in 2017, only three produced more live foals in 2018 than in 2017 as reported at this time last year: Ontario, New Mexico, and Pennsylvania. The following table shows the 10 states and provinces,

The statistics include 334 progeny of stallions standing in North America but foaled abroad, as reported by foreign stud book

authorities at the time of publication.

The report also includes 90 mares bred to 27 stallions in North America on Southern Hemisphere time; the majority of these mares have not foaled.

Warren Harang III requested that Roger Heitzmann call the roll. Not in attendance were Jim Montgomery and Michele Rodriguez.

Warren asked Jake Delhomme to lead us in prayer.

Warren asked for nominations for the position of President of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association. Charlotte Clavier nominated Warren to serve as President. Tom Early seconded the motion. With no objections and no additional nominations, Warren Harang III was elected President for the 2018-2019 year.

Warren opened the floor for nominations to serve as 1st Vice President. Tom nominated Jake Delhomme. This nomination was seconded by Danny Guidry. Hearing no objections or any additional nominations, Jake Delhomme was elected to serve as 1ST Vice President for the 2018-2019 year.

Warren then requested nominations for 2nd Vice President. Jake Delhomme made a motion to nominate Brett Brinkman as 2nd Vice President. Tom seconded the motion, and hearing no objections and no additional nominations the motion carried and Brett was elected 2nd Vice President.

Warren requested a motion to approve the minutes from the Board

of Directors Meeting held on June 11, 2018. Roger noted a mistake made in the minutes, pointing it out to the Board. Danny made a motion to accept the minutes as presented with the reworded correction. This motion was seconded by Tom Early, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Warren introduced our newly elected Board Member, Carrol Castille, to the members of the board. The Board of Directors then presented their Conflict of Interest Polices to Roger Heitzmann of which he read aloud to the members and audience present:

Jake Delhomme: he owns 12.5 % of the stallions Calibrochoa and Redding Collier who are standing at Red River Farm with Jay Adcock. He buys supplies from board members Carrol Castille's Ranch Outlet as well as Stemmans Supply operated by Charlotte Stemmans Clavier. He also breeds and boards mares at members of the boards farms.

Warren Harang: He boards and breeds at Clear Creek Stud.

Brett Brinkman: owns and operates Brett Brinkman's Training Stable as well as Le Mesa Stallions. In this he provides services to members and board members of the LTBA who are in the racing and breeding industry.

Val Murrell: Owns and operates Clear Creek Stud. Val does business with most of the members of the board as well as many members of the association. These services include but are not limited to breeding, hauling, boarding, breaking, etc. His daughter Michelle LaVoice is the Farm Manager and is also a member of the board.

Michelle LaVoice: She is the Farm Manager of Clear Creek Stud, working for her father who also is a member of the board. She also owns and breeds thoroughbred mares.

Danny Guidry: Partner in the Law Firm of Guidry & Guidry, a Director of Home Bank, a partner in DocAtty Stables, a member in the LLC Brett Carrol & Friends Racing and an owner of a percentage of the stallion Court Vision. He buys equipment from Ranch Outlet, as well as Stemmans Supply. He is also a share holder in Equine Sales of Louisiana.

Neal McFadden: Stockholder in Equine Sales of Louisiana. He owns mares in partnership with Jay Adcock, as well as boarding these mares at Jay Adcock's Red River Farm. He is also a partner owning stallion shares with Jay Adcock, Jim Montgomery, and Jake Delhomme.

Carrol Castille: owns Ranch Outlet serving many of the horsemen as well as members of the board. Carrol also owns and operates Whispering Oaks Farm as well as Castille Racing handling the business of many members of the association as well as members of the board.

Charlotte Clavier: President of Stemmans Inc., as well as Vice President of Traders Rest Farm Inc. She has business dealings with most of the members of the association as well as most of the board of directors. She is Vice President of the Louisiana HBPA and the Treasurer of the Racetrack Employee Assistance Program. She also oversees the HBPA Pension Program as well the Insurance Program.

Tom Early: Owns a share in the stallion Custom for Carlos who stands at Clear Creek Stud. He owns a share in the stallion Apriority, who stands at Elite. Tom has business dealings with Ranch Outlet, Stemmans Supply, Whispering Oaks Farm and Equine Sales of Louisiana.

Jay Adcock: Owns and operates Red River Farm with his wife Terry and son Brandon. He boards, breeds, and sells to many members of the association as well as members of the board. He is partners with board members Neal McFadden, Jim Montgomery and Jake Delhomme in mares as well as stallions. He is also a share holder in Equine sales of Louisiana.

Roger Heitzmann: His brother Eric trains a public stable. His brother Mike is the General Manager of Stone Bridge Farm in Lexington, KY. His brother David is the Director of Racing at Harrah's Louisiana Downs.

Linda McLellan: She occasionally does freelance photography and design work. Some of her clients have been members of the board past and present.

Loretta Romero: She and her husband own and operate Romero Farm that boards and rehabilitates thoroughbreds for members of the association. She is also Vice President of the Backstretch Benevolent Fund.

Beverly Mayard: She has no conflicts

Therese Arroyo: She is a director of Louisiana Horse Rescue as well a Director of the St. Rita Finance Board.

Michelle Salvino: Is a part time clocker with the Fair Grounds Race Course.

Rachel Gandy: She has no conflicts.

Warren continued with the meeting introducing attorney Mr. Alex Bonin. Mr. Bonin is an attorney who operates a Law-Firm in the city of New Orleans. He is familiar with horse racing as he is an avid fan of the sport. He is also the son of a Judge Paul Bonin, who operated as the Attorney for the Association for many years. The Executive Committee spoke about the replacing of Mr. Ross Brupbacher who requested to Warren that we find a replacement due to health issues. Warren asked the Board to approve him as

our new attorney. Tom made the motion to hire Mr. Bonin as our new attorney. This motion was seconded by Charlotte Clavier, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Committee Reports:

By-Law: Val Murrell – Chairman

Val requested that the report be moved to the end of the meeting and spoke about in Executive Session.

Finance & Audit: Tom Early – Chairman

Tom asked if everyone had received their Financial Statements for the month ending June 30, 2018. Everyone acknowledged they had so we proceeded. Tom requested Roger Heitzmann hit on a few points as to where we stand through the first half of the year. Roger presented the financials to the board. Charlotte commented on the new look of the main office at the Fair Grounds and how fresh it looks.

Roger then proceeded to explain the budget for the year. After presenting the budget he asked for three line items in the budget to be adjusted.

First, Roger requested that the budget for Bank and Credit Card fees be adjusted to reflect the amount of processing done on line. He requested it be adjusted from \$350 to \$1000. Tom made the motion to adjust the budget accordingly. The motion was seconded by Carrol Castille, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Secondly, Roger requested that the Budget reflect the monies needed for the improvements made to the Fair Grounds office as well as other expenses. He requested the budget reflect an amount of \$25000. Michelle LaVoice made the motion to increase the budget on maintenance and repairs to \$25000. The motion was seconded by Jake Delhomme, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

After the discussion Charlotte Clavier made a motion that the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association awards an Honorary Lifetime Membership to the Commissioner of Agriculture Dr. Mike Strain, and House of Representatives'

Member Major Thibaut for their tireless effort working on behalf of our industry. Tom Early seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Grievance: Michele LaVoice – Chairperson

Michelle requested that this be discussed in Executive Session.

Inspection: Brett Brinkman – Chairman

Brett asked that we discuss in Executive Session in conjunction to the Grievance Committee.

LTBA/HBPA Liaison Committee: Val Murrell – Chairman

Val yielded the floor to the Executive Director of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protection Association (HBPA). Subjects such as summer racing in Louisiana, the numbers involved, legislative happenings on the HBPA side, were discussed by all, including members in attendance. No decisions were made, however more information was shared enabling us to work together in the future.

LTBA/LSRC: Jake Delhomme – Chairman

Jake informed the board that everything he wanted to speak about was already covered.

Membership & Nominating Committee: Charlotte Clavier – Chairperson

Charlotte informed the board that the election went well. She welcomed Carroll Castille to the board as its newest member and thanked Nathan Granger for the time that he served. Warren congratulated the members of the board who were reelected to serve another term.

PAC Committee: Michele Rodriguez – Chairperson

Michele was not present for the meeting and there was no report for this meeting.

Salary & Benefits: Tom Early – Chairman

Tom informed that he had nothing to report. Warren asked that the guests attending please introduce themselves.

New Business:

Neal McFadden brought up a change that was made a couple of years ago in an effort to cut cost. We had eliminated the inspection of mares of members of the board on a regular basis as they are officers of the association and obligated to report any violation made that they were aware of. Failure to do so would mean a more substantial penalty for the board member than a regular member of the association who is not an officer of the association. After discussion Charlotte made a motion that the mares or stallions owned by members of the board be included in the percentage of mares that the inspector will keep tabs on. This motion was seconded by Val Murrell., which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Warren called for Executive Session. Michele LaVoice seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Jake Delhomme made a motion to end Executive Session. This motion was seconded by Carrol Castille, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

In Executive Session Val Murrell Chairman of the By-Laws Committee, spoke to the board of the declining numbers of Louisiana breeds and asked what we can do to prevent it. Val feels that the restrictions placed on breeders by our by-laws need to be addressed. Val brought several ideas to the board which resulted in excited conversation. However it was obvious that some change may need to happen. The door was left open for further discussion on domicile requirements, percent of breeders' awards, requirements to breed, exit plans, sale mares, and mare registration.

Michele LaVoice the Chairperson of the Grievance Committee presented three Grievances to board. The first grievance was discussed was brought to the board by Richard Klein and Lora Pitre. After Michelle's presentation a motion was made by Tom Early to disallow the grievance. Mr. Klein would have to become a regular member of the association and register the mares in question at the regular registration price. Carol Castille seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

The grievance requested by Carl Moore was then presented. After discussion Brett Brinkman made a motion that the grievance is denied and the filly in question not be allowed to make up futurity payments. This motion was seconded by Jake Delhomme, which was voted on and passed unanimously

The third grievance involved Jon Dean and Jason Hall. Roger read a letter to the association from Mr. Dean and presented the documentation received by the association in association with the mare and foal. After discussion the board decided that the grievance be denied. Charlotte Clavier made a motion that the mare would have to register with the association with Jon Dean as the owner at the regular mare registration price and pay a fine of \$200 for leaving the program early. Neal McFadden seconded this motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

There was no old business to attend to.
